#### FLU SEASON MORE SEVERE THAN USUAL

The flu season in Snohomish County is proving to be <u>more severe than usual</u>. Three adults in our county have died from flu complications in the past several weeks.

Washing your hands, covering your coughs, and staying home when you are sick are effective ways to reduce spreading and getting diseases. The best way to prevent illness is vaccination.

Getting a current flu shot is the best way to protect yourself and others. Everyone 6 months and older should get a shot every year, since the flu vaccine changes to match the most common illnesses.

# Where to get a flu shot:

- Everett School District Employees who are on one of the district medical plans (Group Health or Premera) should go to their medical center/provider. Flu vaccines are a covered benefit under your plan.
- Everett School District Employees who are on a spouse's or partner's medical plan should contact their insurance provider to verify that flu vaccines are a covered benefit and if so, go to their medical center/provider.

# 45 MINUTES FOR 45 DAYS – not so hard, after all! Tips on making it "yours!"

Remember that it's **YOUR CHALLENGE** you can design your 45 minutes of accumulated activity every day in any way that provides a challenge for YOU.

One way is to include more movement throughout your day rather than one intense 45 minute session. Did you know that if you incorporate a 90-second burst of physical activity every 30 minutes during your day, that adds up to 20 minutes in 12 hours *and* combats sitting disease. Your 90-second bursts might be chair squats, balancing on one foot, stretching, marching in place, taking the stairs, a quick walk around your building. (One not-to-be-named staff person marches in place while her electric toothbrush does its thing –

getting healthy teeth and two more minutes of activity each day!)

If you enrolled in the Wellness Challenge after January 15 and missed the start date or did not hear about <u>45 for 45</u> you still have the opportunity to challenge yourself.

The next <u>45 for 45</u> challenge begins the day after Valentine's Day. (Click to register) Burn off that chocolate; love yourself with 45 minutes of activity each day.
