THOUSAND STUDENTS

The Everett Public Schools student population grows larger every year. As of 2012 we service over 18,600 students.

TONS OF WASTE

During the school year, the district generates 70 tons of waste per month on average.

THOUSAND DOLLARS

The district spends approximately \$75,000 per year to dispose of the 70 tons of waste generated per month.

Seven schools in the district are participating in the Washington Green Schools "green" program, which means that schools can show that their programs engage students, conserve resources and save money.

Paper & Cardboard

 The district contracts with "Fibers International" which provides and empties the bins at no cost to the district!

Plastic, Metal, Glass and more

 The district contracts with Rubatino (north end) and Waste Management (south end) for carts at all schools.

E-Recycling

 The district utilizes the company "1 Green Planet," a non-profit organization that recycles all IT equipment and refrigerators, TVs, etc at no cost to the district!



Nearly 100 Jefferson students signed up to be part of the green team. Students signed contracts committing to regular attendance and participation in order to make their school a "greener" place.
