Every Friday morning at Eisenhower Middle School, [Amy Ruotsala's](#) leadership students come early to school to sort and bag bread donated by Panera and get it ready to help others.

Karen Pauley, a para-educator at Eisenhower, coordinates the delivery with parents. Then [Matt Johnson](#), eighth-grade block teacher, greets parent volunteers with several huge plastic containers of Panera's bread ready for delivery.

Some of this bread is given to Eisenhower students who come from families that need extra support. Some of the bread is taken over to Jackson Elementary and Everett High School for families there.
