Association of Washington School Principals (AWSP) met in Spokane to recognize excellence



On June 24 at the 33rd annual Summer Conference (co-hosted by AWSP and the Washington Association of School Administrators), AWSP President Jeff Miller, retiring principal at East Valley High School, presented AWSP President's Special Recognition awards to nine individuals from across the state.

This group of practicing principals, university researchers and industry experts was recognized for creating *Version 2.0* of the *AWSP Leadership Framework*. The *AWSP Leadership Framework* has been adopted by nearly all the state's 295 school districts as the framework for the state's new required principal evaluation system. "The team has been working on *Version 2.0* for over a year now and I've been so impressed with the depth of the new resource section, and the sheer practical

application in the soon-to-be-released user's guide," said Miller. "Their work will smooth the way for principal evaluation for years to come."

Version 2.0, which was released last month, includes an <u>online library</u> of hundreds of supporting resources for principals' professional growth, and a user's guide with forms and examples to help principals with the more procedural side of the evaluation process.
