Please write an essay on the following question:

On the steps of the Lincoln Memorial, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. spoke of his dreams for our nation. 50 years later, what are your dreams for this nation and how would you suggest the nation achieve them?

Background and Instructions:

Consider how Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s legacy affected the civil rights and other important issues of all Americans. 50 years ago in 1963 during the March on Washington, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. spoke of his dreams that "one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: 'We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal." What are your dreams for this nation and how would you suggest that our nation achieve them?

Entries may be typed or handwritten and should include: Name, Phone Number, School, Teacher, and Grade. This information should be on the upper right hand corner of the first page of the entry.

Word Limit:

Grades 6-8: minimum: 250 words maximum: 750 words Grades 9-12: minimum: 500 words maximum: 1,000 words

Contest Deadline: No later than 5 p.m. on Friday, December 13, 2013

Note: Although the question is the same for both grade groups, there will be separate contest winners for Grade 6-8 and for Grade 9-12.
