- **New this season**. This year's arsenal of weapons to fight flu includes nasal spray and injectable vaccine that will defend you against four strains of influenza. Also new is an egg-free version for people who are allergic to

- eggs. Not all providers have the new products call ahead to check their availability.
- **"Super" for seniors**. Are you 65 or older? Ask your provider about high-dose flu vaccine. This vaccine is four times stronger than the vaccine recommended for under 65.
- Plenty in stock. The "routine" vaccine contains three strains of influenza virus. This vaccine is readily
 available and in good supply throughout the county.
