"In fact, they won a *Robot Design* trophy for designing and building a robot with elegant simplicity, but able to solve complex game challenges. This was proven when their robot held on to the 10th place spot during the challenges."

This is such a big win for the eighth-graders who have been hard at this for three years, but also a great thrill for the newest team members who just joined. An amazing feat they should be proud to share with their families, friends, and school," added Baldwin.

The <u>state competition</u>, held in Ellensburg, will bring together the best of the best of western and eastern Washington to compete for a spot in the national competition in St. Louis, Missouri in April.
