Henry M. Jackson High School science research students win coveted *Advisor's Award*

Brooke Parsons and Shruti Parikh, members of Henry M. Jackson's Research and Engineering Club, received the *Advisor's Favorite* Award at the <u>Imagine Tomorrow</u> competition held in Pullman Washington on Saturday, May 30.

Their project <u>Designing a Coal Train Cover Using an</u> <u>Electrostatically Charged Air Filter to Prevent Coal Loss</u> was chosen from 185 other projects involving over 600 students from high schools in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Montana as the favorite of science team advisors that attended the competition.

"Imagine Tomorrow is our club's biggest challenge with the very specialized and limited number of categories of

competition and only 21 teams' total projects gaining recognition, the competition is especially fierce," said Andy Sevald, Henry M. Jackson's Science Research and Engineering Club Advisor.
