South precinct classes will be held at the Cathcart Way Operations Center (8915 Cathcart Way, Snohomish) on Thursday evenings beginning January 29. Classes are 6:30 to 9:30 p.m., with one Saturday field trip.

The program will include classroom training, hands-on participation, and the opportunity to ride on patrol with a deputy. Attendees will learn about:

- Traffic operations and collision investigations
- K-9 enforcement
- Drugs and gangs
- Domestic violence
- Child abuse
- Crime scene technology
- Major crime investigations
- Sex offenders
- Jail operations
- Search and rescue
- Special weapons and tactics (SWAT)
