# GOOD NEWS for high school juniors about SBA benefits

## College remedial classes? Maybe not!

High school juniors can eliminate the need for college remedial classes by earning a 3 or a 4 on the on the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) this spring.

A score of 3 or 4 in your junior year makes you eligible in college to move directly into credit-bearing college-level classes (at the 100 level and above) when you enroll at any of the state's 34 community and technical colleges, any of the public baccalaureate institutions and nine independent colleges after graduation NEXT year.

Just provide your Washington college or technical school a copy of your SBA scores once you are admitted.
