## Garfield Elementary earns state School of Distinction award

Students in only 92 Washington state schools did well enough over five consecutive years for their schools to earn this award



Schools showing consistent improvement trends over a long period catch the attention of groups looking for exceptional schools. That trend also earns of those schools the title *School of Distinction*. Only 92 schools in the state met the criteria for the 2015 award – five years of students having continuously improved reading and math scores. One of those 92 schools is Garfield Elementary in Everett.

"Improving scores one or two years in a row is an accomplishment," notes Superintendent Gary Cohn. "Holding and achieving that continuous improvement standard for five years is very difficult. Such a sustained improvement track record means the students, their families, the staff and the school system are in sync with quality instruction, high expectations and high support."

Seven out of ten students at Garfield qualify for free or reduced lunch. Sixteen percent speak a language other than English. "Students living in poverty and coming to school without English language skills face special challenges that can interfere with learning unless a school has supports for them," explains Dr. Joyce Stewart, the district's associate superintendent of teaching and learning for the northern region. "The Garfield community works with the school and families to offset those challenges. The school is a shining example of 'a whole village' coming together with a growth mindset to meet the learning needs of each child."

Superintendent Cohn notes that Garfield staff and "...staff at every other school in the district are deeply analyzing not just *what* is taught but *how* teachers are using their professional skills and artistry to engage students, spark their curiosity and ignite self-motivated learning."
