Please write an essay on the following question:

Rev. Dr. Martin King Jr. wrote in his "Letter from Birmingham Jail":

"Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere. All men are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly.... I can never be what I ought to be until you are what you ought to be, and you can never be what you ought to be until I am what I ought to be..."

What do you need to be in order for others to be what they need to be in order to have justice for everyone?

Background and Instructions:

Consider how Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s legacy affected the civil rights and other important issues of all Americans. Over 50 years ago in 1963 during the March on Washington, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. spoke of his dreams that "one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: 'We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal.'" His method was with nonviolent protest. Do you think that peaceful nonviolent protest is still an effective method to bring social justice to all?

Entries may be typed or handwritten and should include: Name, Phone Number, School, Teacher, and Grade. This information should be on the upper right hand corner of the first page of the entry.

Word Limit:

Grades 6-8: minimum: 250 words maximum: 750 words
Grades 9-12: minimum: 500 words maximum: 1,000 words
Adult 18 & over: minimum: 500 words maximum: 1,250 words

Contest Deadline: No later than 5 p.m. on Friday, February 5, 2016

Note: Although the question is the same for both grade groups, there will be separate

contest winners for Grade 6-8 and for Grade 9-12.


