## H.M. Jackson students are best-in-state for their mobile app


Students now competing for national title, \$15,000 and MIT mentors

Inspired by a friend with epilepsy, a JHS team of innovators entered the <u>Verizon Innovative App</u> <u>Challenge</u>.

Their app concept is a cost-effective and innovative medical tool for the 1 million Americans diagnosed each year with a chronic brain disease. The app is also for those looking to learn more about their brain health. By connecting to a low-cost EEG headband by Bluetooth, the students' app can:

- Display real-time data and analysis of the user's brainwaves
- Detect abnormalities such as seizures, strokes and stress) and notify the user or a caregiver
- Provide personalized feedback for improving brain health
- Engage and educate the user with minigames about the brain

The design team has already been named <u>Best in State</u> for their concept. Now, representing all of Washington state at the national level, they are seeking the <u>Fan Favorite Award.</u>
