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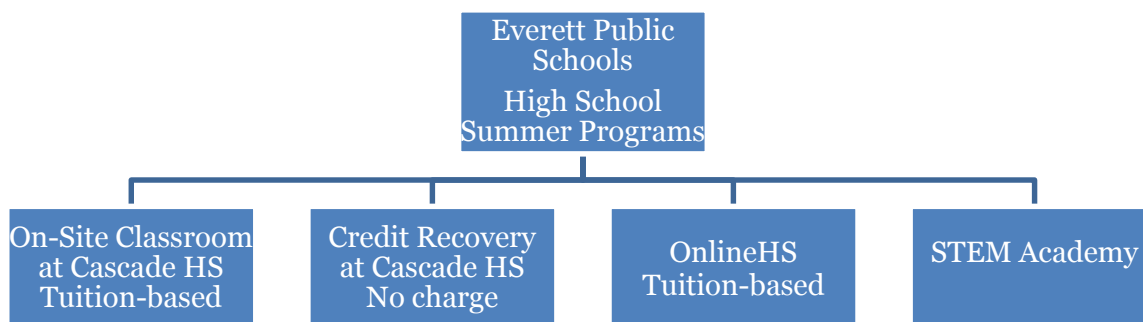

SUMMER SCHOOL 2016 – Quick Facts

Summer School Dates:	July 5 – August 12 at Cascade H.S.
Registration for summer school is web-based:	March 21 – June 22 www.everettsd.org/summerschool
If taking an OnlineHS course for the first time:	Must view REQUIRED on-line orientation and complete first unit by July 10.
Students in OnlineHS courses:	Must complete first unit prior to July 8th.
If you want to take two OnlineHS courses:	You can only take Lifetime Fitness (PE) concurrently with another course. If you want to take two (2) classes (that doesn't include PE), you must finish the first course by July 22, after which you'll be enrolled in the second course.
On-site courses:	Three (3) absences may result in no-credit. Students MUST attend last two (2) days.

High School Summer Programs

This booklet describes the **Everett Public Schools 2016 High School Summer Programs** available for students who will be entering 9 – 12 grades during the 2016-17 school year. This year, students will be able to choose from a variety of learning opportunities designed to provide flexible summer planning. Students may choose between two sessions of On-Site classes which will be held at Cascade High School or enroll in our Summer Program's OnlineHS Program.

Our Summer Program includes opportunities for students to strengthen the skills and knowledge required for graduation, repeat course(s), extend their interest(s) in an academic area(s) and career related fields.

A limited amount of tuition assistance is available through your high school counselor/success coordinator.

Priority will be given to students who are credit deficient (credit recovery) and with demonstrated financial need (participation in free or reduced lunch program).

ON-SITE PROGRAMS

There are a wide variety of regular education classes offered on-site at Cascade High School for students to earn credit toward graduation. The course offerings are listed on Page 8.

ONLINEHS PROGRAM

Online learning provides an opportunity for students to take classes off-site. Online learning is not for every student. The course offerings for our 2016 OnlineHS Programs are listed on Page 7.

Tuition-Based High School Summer Programs General Information 2016

The 2016 High School Summer Program term begins **Tuesday, July 5, 2016** and ends **Friday, August 12, 2016**. Summer School is open to all current high school students, including incoming ninth graders, in Everett Public Schools, as well as out-of-district high school students who are in good standing with their home district. Students may choose between two sessions of on-site classes at Cascade High School. **Session 1 is from 7:30 a.m. to 10:15 a.m.** and **Session 2 is from 10:45 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.**

Transportation

Transportation will be provided by Everett Public Schools to Cascade High School from routes stopping at Everett, Jackson and Sequoia High Schools. The buses will depart Cascade at 10:30 a.m. for Session 1 and 1:45 p.m. for Session 2. See the summer school website for bus stop locations and exact pick-up times.

Food Services

Food service will be provided at no cost during summer school. Students are allowed to bring snacks. Cascade is a closed campus; students are expected to remain on campus during breaks and lunch time.

Attendance

Three (3) absences from a six (6) week course may result in the student receiving NO credit for the course in which he/she is enrolled. Absences include time accumulated for tardiness, early departure and disciplinary reasons.

Attendance necessary for learning the content to ensure completion of course requirements for all high school courses.

Credits

Students may sign up for a maximum of 1.0 credit.

OnlineHS Course Information

Student Expectations

- ◆ Students must complete the “REQUIRED INTRO” by noon of July 8th or they will be dropped from the course;
- ◆ Maintain weekly contact with the instructor; and
- ◆ Meet all class deadlines.

On-Site Assistance

Teachers will be on-site, Wednesdays from 9:00 – 11:00 a.m.

Credits

Except for Lifetime Fitness (PE), students may only enroll in **one (1) .5 credit** class at a time. To enroll in a second course, students must earn a passing grade in the first class by July 25. The course fee for the second class will be the same rate as the first course.

Log-in utilizes student ID number and student password (student login at school). Registration is not completed until tuition payment has been received and verified. You can pay at the time of the web-based registration with a credit card, or if paying by cash or check, print out a copy of the confirmation email and take it to your school's ASB treasurer. - **Tuition Payment Is Required at Time of Registration**

All students who register for a class are required to pay at the time of registration. Payments can be made either online with a credit card, or by cash or check (made payable to Everett Public Schools).

TUITION ASSISTANCE (For Everett Public Schools Students Only)

LIMITED tuition assistance is available. Information about possible tuition assistance is available through your school success coordinator or counselor. Priority is given to students who are credit deficient and signed-up for free or reduced lunch prior to May 1, 2016.

Students living within the Everett Public Schools district boundary, who do not attend Everett Public Schools **OR** students who are living outside the Everett Public Schools district who wish to attend summer school, need to call the summer school office at 425-385-5170 for registration information.

TUITION PAYMENT IS REQUIRED PRIOR TO BEGINNING CLASS

All students who register for a class are required to pay in full at the time of registration. For non-Everett Public Schools students, payment can only be made by cash or check (payable to Everett Public Schools) on June 30th between 1:30 – 3:30 p.m. at Cascade High School, 801 E Casino Rd., Everett, WA 98203.

Online Course information:

Students may take two (2) OnlineHS classes during the summer and except for Lifetime Fitness (PE), the courses will be taken one after the other. Lifetime Fitness is the only course that can be taken concurrently with another OnlineHS course during summer.

To be eligible to enroll in a second summer OnlineHS course, you must earn a passing grade in the first course prior to Friday, July 22. This allows time to complete the second course before the end of summer semester on August 12.

Tuition for the second course is due at the time you enroll in the second class. The fee for a second course will be at the same rate paid for the first class during the initial enrollment.

English 9 Semester 1 & 2

Grade: 9
 Course Code: Semester 1: ENG101
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Course Code: Semester 2: ENG102
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Note: Students needing a full 1.0 credit need first and second sessions of this class.

Description:

Students will work on improving reading skills, increase understanding of various literature, and improve writing skills. Each course will work on reading comprehension, analysis, and critical thinking as well as content, organization, style and conventions in both expository and persuasive writing.

English 10 Semester 1 & 2

Grade: 10
 Course Code: Semester 1: ENG201
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Course Code: Semester 2: ENG202

Note: Students needing a full 1.0 credit need first and second sessions of this class.

Description:

Students will work on improving reading skills, increase understanding of world literature and improve writing skills. Each course will work on reading comprehension, analysis and critical thinking as well as content, organization, style and conventions in expository, persuasive and argumentative writing.

English 11 Semester 1 & 2

Grade: 11
 Course Code: Semester 1: ENG301
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Course Code: Semester 2: ENG302
 Credits: 0.5 Credit

Note: Students needing a full 1.0 credit need first and second sessions of this class.

Description:

Students will work on improving reading skills in order to better analyze and interpret both informational text and American Literature. Students will work on improving their writing in order to write both a research-based argumentative paper and literary analysis essays. Each course will work on reading comprehension, analysis and critical thinking as well as content, organization, style and conventions in expository, persuasive and argumentative writing.

Summer 2016

English 12

Grade: 12
 Course Code: ENG401
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Description:

Students will work on improving reading skills in order to better analyze and interpret both informational text and a variety of literature. Students will work on improving their writing. The course will work on reading comprehension, analysis and critical thinking as well as content, organization, style and conventions in various modes of writing.

Creative Writing

Grade: 10 – 12
 Course Code: ENG511
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Description:

Creative writing is the process of inventing, the process of making something new and different, something made up. But it also has solid roots in the real-world experiences and memories of the writer—fact and fiction, blending together. Through both a crafting of your own works and study of past and current masters of prose and poetry, you discover not only what a poem or story means but also what techniques authors use to create that meaning. Elements of fiction such as metaphor, simile, personification, irony, point of view, plot, characterization, dialogue, scene, narration, theme, voice, and style will be. You will understand and use the steps of the writing process. The course covers the following genres: poetry, research, and memoir.

This course is designed to provide instructional and advisory support for students to complete a Digital Portfolio, High School and Beyond Plan, and Culminating Project to meet the district's graduation requirement.

Algebra I Semester 1 & 2

Grade: 9 – 12
 Course Code: Semester 1: MTH101
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Course Code: Semester 2: MTH102
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Description:

This course will include an introduction to the use of variables, rational and irrational numbers, operations on polynomials, solution of linear and quadratic equations and the factoring of polynomials. We will be offering this course for .5 credit each session.

Algebra II w/Trig Semester 1 & 2

Grade: 9 – 12
 Course Code: Semester 1: MTH301
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Course Code: Semester 2: MTH302
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Description:

The first part of this course will be devoted to a review of the concepts and skills learned in Algebra I. Topics will be extended to include methods of solving equations, solutions of systems of equations, inequalities, factoring polynomials, work with exponents and scientific notation, graphing, radicals, conic sections, logarithms, sequences and series, complex numbers and trigonometry.

Geometry Semester 1 & 2

Grade: 9 – 12
 Course Code: Semester 1: MTH201
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Course Code: Semester 2: MTH202
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Description:

This course includes the study of logical reasoning, algebraic applications, and characteristics of geometric forms such as points, lines, planes, angles, polygons and solids. Students learn by measuring, experimenting, verifying and reasoning. We will be offering this course for 0.5 credit each session.

Pre-Calculus Semester 1 & 2

Grade: 9 – 12
 Course Code: Semester 1: MTH401
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Course Code: Semester 2: MTH402
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Description:

This is the first of two courses designed to provide students with the necessary preparation for studying calculus and other college mathematics courses. This course reviews algebraic properties and then introduces functions and graphs. As students continue with the course, they will learn about algebraic and inverse functions, exponential and logarithmic functions, conic sections, matrices, determinants, complex numbers, and discrete algebra. Throughout the course, they will discover examples of the role of mathematics in daily life.

Biology Semester 1

Grade: 9 – 12
 Course Code: Semester 1: SCI201
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Course Code: Semester 2: SCI202
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

With required on-site laboratory time

Description:

Biology is a laboratory course covering the study of living things. Students will learn about the world of animals, plants and microorganisms and learn to make wise decisions concerning biological issues that impact all life, including health and environmental challenges.

IMPORTANT NOTE: On-site Labs are a requirement for this course. Labs will be scheduled on specific Wednesday mornings throughout the summer term (dates to be announced).

Course Descriptions

World History Semester 1 & 2

Grade: 10
 Course Code: Semester 1: SOC201
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Course Code: Semester 2: SOC202
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: **On-Site or OnlineHS**

Note: Students needing a full 1.0 credit may sign up for the first and second sessions of this class.

Description:

The goal of World History is to prepare students to participate in a pluralistic, democratic society through understanding multiple perspectives, making/evaluating decisions based on reason and evidence, respecting various cultures and recognizing their role in a global economy. Students will explore and analyze the world from 1450-1914 during first semester. Skills that will be focused on include: distinguishing between fact, opinion and reasoned argument, and recognizing point of view. Students will explore and analyze the world from 1914 - present during second semester. Skills that will be focused on include: developing an argument and supporting it with both primary and secondary sources. Other topics that will be examined include: causes and effects of conflict, human and civil rights, the global impact of health improvements, population growth and scientific developments, genocide and terrorism. This course fulfills the World History Social Studies graduation requirement.

WA State History

Grade: 12
 Course Code: SOC401
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: **On-Site or Online**

Description:

In Washington State History students will learn about the geologic, environmental, historical, economic and current factors that have created the present-day state of Washington and its people. Students will study from Ancient Pacific Northwest to present day and the current structure and politics of Washington State and local governments. This course fulfills the Washington State History Social Studies graduation requirement.

Government

Grade: 12
 Course Code: SOC501
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: **On-Site or OnlineHS**

Description:

This course will examine the structure of the United States federal government and the rights of its citizens under the Constitution. Included in the course is the study of the structure of the American federal and state governments, the political process and political parties in the American system and the examination of governments in other nations. It is designed to prepare students for effective citizenship, voting and understanding their rights and responsibilities. This course fulfills the Government Social Studies Graduation requirement.

US History Semester 1 & 2

Grade: 11
 Course Code: Semester 1: SOC301
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Course Code: Semester 2: SOC302
 Credits: 0.5 Credit
 Available: **On-Site or Online**

Note: Students needing a full 1.0 credit may sign up for the first and second sessions of this class.

Description:

In this course students will develop their analytical, critical thinking, problem-solving and group processing skills while studying time periods in US History. Students will study the following time periods: Review of Early US History, Civil War, Reconstruction, Industrial Revolution, the Gilded Age, the development of US Foreign policy during WWI and WWII, the Cold War, the Civil Rights and Vietnam War Era, and the contemporary United States. Students will not only have a solid understanding of the facts, but also question assumed truths, recognize patterns, analyze motives, synthesize information, make relevant connections, predict probable outcomes, draw their own conclusions and apply what they've learned to current situations and events. This course fulfills the US History Social Studies graduation requirement.

Tuition-Based High School Summer Programs

Course Description

Contemporary Global Issues

Grade: 11 – 12
Course Code: Elective: SOC670
Credits: 0.5 Credit
Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Description:

As current as the latest headlines, this class will explore world events and issues by looking for their causes and historical background. Students will study and analyze national changes, world-wide changes, trends and predictions for the future. Information for classroom discussion will come from current publications (newspapers, magazines, and internet). Students who enjoy politics, current events, debates, class discussions, and role playing will enjoy this course. This is an elective course.

Art History

Grade: 9 – 12
Course Code: Semester 1: FAA169
Credits: 0.5 Credit
Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Description:

Art History online is a survey of visual art styles throughout history. Spanning the time from early Egyptian tomb art to contemporary public art, this class gives students a sense of how art is entwined into the lives of humans from ancient cultures to today. The course assists students in researching form, function, technique and style by viewing art objects and creating their own art.

PE

Grade Levels: 9 – 12
Course Code: PED101
Credits: 0.5 Credit (Graduation requirement)
Available: **On-Site or Online**

Description:

An understanding of fitness concepts and practices is essential for students. Teaching our student's good health and safety principles can lead to a life of healthy practices, resulting in more productive, active and successful lives. In this course, students will demonstrate an understanding of the five components of fitness and implement a personal fitness plan.

Health

Grade Levels: 9 – 12
Course Code: HTH101
Credits: 0.5 Credit (Graduation requirement)
Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Description:

So much of personal health is related to making good decisions. This course will present students with information and decision-making skills for developing healthy choices. Topics include Body Systems, Nutrition, Exercise, Mental Health, Drugs, and Disease. Throughout the course students will have opportunities to analyze and evaluate information and situations related to health, which will provide opportunities to practice skills for good decisions for a healthy future.

Lifetime Fitness

Grade Levels: 9 – 12
Course Code: PED101 (1st time online PED)
PED102 (2nd or 3rd time online PE)
Credits: 0.5 Credit
Available: ***OnlineHS Only***

Description:

An understanding of fitness concepts and practices is essential for students. Teaching our student's good health and safety principles can lead to a life of healthy practices, resulting in more productive, active and successful lives. In this course, students will demonstrate an understanding of the five components of fitness and implement a personal fitness plan.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Students are REQUIRED to participate in developing a personal Fitness Plan which will include activity/exercise for five (5) days a week, for an hour each day. Students will complete a detailed Activity Log documenting their activities for each week of the summer term. Meets all state standards for Lifetime Fitness.

Transportation will be provided by Everett Public Schools to Cascade High School from the following routes stopping at Sequoia, Everett and Jackson High Schools.
