Superintendent's Scholar Award finalists for 2016

Four graduating seniors recognized at annual event

To be considered for the award, nominees must be in the top five percent of their graduating class or have scored in the top five percent of seniors who have taken the Scholastic Aptitude Test. Counselors at each high school select three representatives from the student applicants. The students are then interviewed by a community selection committee designated by the Everett Public Schools Foundation and one student from each school is chosen.
