Latino Art Field Trips: May 15-26

The exhibit will provide a range of Latino Art from carvings and pottery to paintings to fiber arts and jewelry and draw on pre-Columbian indigenous motifs and stories. The main focus is to increase cross-cultural awareness of Latino Identity, as well as an understanding of how art is used to pass on to future generations a people's history, values, and traditions.

Field Trips last 75 minutes and include a docent led tour, artists in action, and a hands-on activity.

Cost is \$50.00 per class, up to 30 students. Appointment times are 9:15-10:30, 10:45-12:00, and 12:15-1:30.

WORKSHOPS AND CLASSES

Workshop – Exploring Latino Art: Integration through Art-Infused Connections is scheduled for November 4 & 5. The Latino community which is the largest minority group in the state is diverse and enjoys a rich history in the Pacific Northwest, along with strong cultural ties to Mexico and the nations of Central, South America and the Caribbean. This ten-hour workshop is designed for the generalist teacher and explores the spiritual and cultural complexity of Latin American art forms and guides teachers through projects that help students learn basic art skills used in making this diverse cultural art. Aligned with our spring 2017 exhibit of Latino Art, specific objectives will focus on integrating Latino Art into the classroom through art-infused connections with social studies/history and culture, language arts, math and science. Standards-based activities will increase cross-cultural awareness, as well as an understanding of how art is used to pass on to future generations a people's history, values, and traditions. Projects, for Kindergarten through 8th grade, will be presented by experienced artists and learning specialists. Assessment strategies will be discussed and all activities are designed to be class-time efficient. Available for SPU credit/clock hours or Everett SD clock hours.

Art Docent Fair: Celebrating Diversity through Artists Students Should Know, November 19, 8:45–12:15 p.m. Come and see artists in action and learn art projects you can do in the classroom. Presenters will focus on a famous artist while discussing the art elements utilized. Cost: \$20 per person or \$100 per school (maximum 10 packets per school). Registration form below.

Course Objectives / Learning Outcomes

Course Objectives: Our goal is to engage teachers with specific hands-on art activities as a means to develop a creative response to content area prompts:

- ♦ Provide a standards base and information on how to effectively embed visual art concepts pertaining to Common Core State Standards (CCSS) in English-Language Arts (ELA) and Math, and Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), History/Social Studies Standards, based on the Washington State Essential Academic Learning Requirements (EALRS) and National Core Arts Standards (NCAS).
- ♦ Provide lesson plans with specific materials, resources, background information, assessments and instructions /directions for aligning visual art learning outcomes with language arts/social studies, math and science.
- ♦ Provide instruction and ideas for engaging students and guiding them to:
Create – conceive and develop new artistic ideas and work; Present – interpret and share artistic work; Respond – understand and evaluate how art conveys meaning; Connect – relate artistic ideas with personal meaning and external context.
- ♦ Provide guidance to formulating the "Big Ideas" / Enduring Understanding that all students will be able to comprehend:
Art is a visual language. Art reflects and contributes to culture. Art is individual expression.

Who is the workshop for? Teachers, youth service providers, parent volunteers, art docents, and interested individuals who want to improve their knowledge and skill and thereby feel more comfortable in teaching and creating art.
