

6	Pearson, myWorld History Early Ages	Accessing GIS maps	In order to access the GIS Maps included in each chapter, teachers must download Google Earth to their computer. 1. Visit https://google.com/earth/ 2. Click the Download Google Earth button in the upper right corner. 3. Agree to the Terms of Service. 4. The app will download in the lower left corner of your screen. 5. Once downloaded, click the file and hit run . 6. Once the app has run, you will be able to access GIS Maps from Pearson Realize. To access GIS Maps on Pearson Realize, follow these steps. 1. Enter your program and select a chapter. 2. Click on the Introduction for that chapter. 3. Scroll to the bottom and select a GIS Map. 4. Open the GIS Map in a new window. 5. Click to save the GIS Map . It will download in the lower left corner of the screen. 6. Once downloaded, open the map. It will automatically use Google Earth to open the map.

8	Pearson, American History	Accessing data about student work completion	Students must Turn in the assignment before it shows as complete. The green checkmark does not mean that students have completed the assignment. In fact, the green checkmark may show the entire time students work on an assignment. Once they have completed the assignment, students should click on the green checkmark. A pop-up box will appear prompting students to Turn in the assignment. Once they click the Turn in button, they will be asked if they're sure they want to turn it in. If they are, then they should click Turn in again and the assignment will be submitted to you. The assignment should now appear as being turned in under the Classes circle on your landing page.	
8	Pearson, American History		Even though the print feature is available, half the primary source gets cut off. However, it is important to remember that the format of the questions was intended for an online platform. Bonus: If students complete the assignment online, the multiple choice questions get scored for the teacher.

The first way is to enter through the "Programs" tab or circle. Students select their assigned program, which brings up the Table of Contents. From there, they can select which topic, and then which lesson, they would like to read. Accessing the digital textbook in this way provides students with print text only, accompanied by a multiple choice question at the end of the lesson. Audio text is not available in this version of the digital textbook. The second way is to enter through the "Classes" tab or circle. This brings up a list of assignments that have been assigned to students, as well as an "eText and Tools" sidebar. Located in this sidebar is an eText version (i.e, World History: Modern eText). Accessing the digital textbook in this way provides students with print text, as well as the option for audio text. However, multiple choice questions are not available in this version of the digital textbook. So, there is a way for students to access the audio version of the book; however, that version won't allow them to answer questions online (unless they go back to the "programs" tab).
