

# **Everett Public Schools ECEAP MONITORING HEALTH & SAFETY PRACTICES POLICY & PROCEDURES**

This policy meets the ECEAP Standard D-3.

ECEAP Standard D-3 Health and Safety Policies and Procedures:

Contractors must have written health and safety policies and procedures on:

- Child abuse and neglect prevention, detection, and reporting.
- Child allergies.
- Disaster plan for emergencies such as fire, earthquake, flood, tsunami, volcanic eruption, or lockdown, as applicable based on location, including practice drills.
- Exclusion of sick children.
- Handling medical, dental, and poisoning emergencies (D-18).
- Infectious disease prevention (C-21, D-13, D-14, D-18).
- Medication management (D-11).
- Monitoring of health and safety practices.
- Pesticide/herbicide management in accordance with RCW 17.21, preventing children's exposure, and using the least hazardous means to control pests and unwanted vegetation (D-6).
- Transportation, if applicable (D-21).

Health and safety practices of Everett Public Schools ECEAP programs will be monitored for completeness and compliance with ECEAP Standards and Everett Public Schools district policies and procedures.

1. Snohomish County ECEAP Nurse and/or Nutritionist will oversee monitoring of all health and safety practices as outlined in Snohomish County ECEAP Work Plan.
2. Everett Public Schools ECEAP Program Coordinator and Program Manager will monitor site health and safety practices or will identify district departments and procedures involved in monitoring.
  - a. Example: Family Support Specialists maintain and monitor children's health files. FSS work with district nurses or ECEAP nurse for special health concerns.
  - b. Example: The safety program for each site is implemented by the building principal and safety committee and is monitored by Business Services department.
