Log in with your six digit student ID number and the same password you use at school. AR tests can be taken anywhere you have internet access. Your points earned and books read will be verified through a report generated by the AR reporting system.

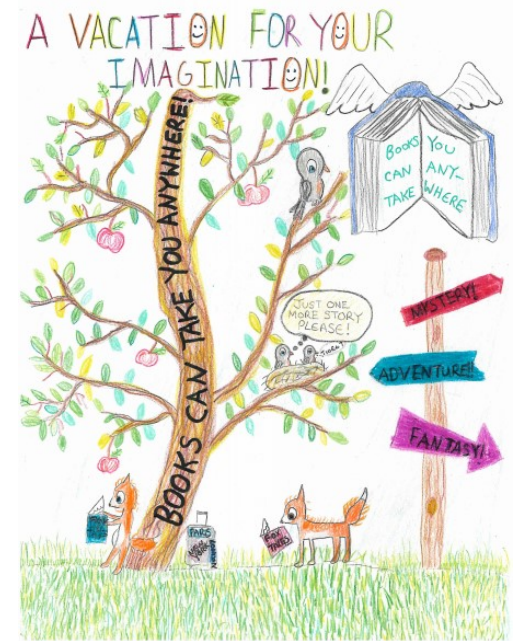

Few things are better than relaxing on a summer day with a good book. Research overwhelmingly shows that reading over the summer break is essential to maintaining and improving a student's literacy levels.

With that in mind, we'd like to remind you of Everett Public Schools summer reading program requirements and the opportunities available to your child.

You and your child's next steps to ensure summer reading is a success:

- Find your child's reading goal in this brochure. Your child's classroom teacher used reading assessment data and knowledge about your child to set an Accelerated Reader (AR) goal.
- Your child should choose books they are interested in, keeping their AR reading goal in mind. It is OK for your child to read books below and above the actual AR range listed in this brochure.
- Each time your child finishes a book, they
 - should take an AR test for that book at home or at school during summer reading hours.
 - can link to AR tests on any connected device by visiting their school's district website.
- As your child reads and passes AR tests, your child will become eligible for rewards.
- It is not necessary for your child to record the books and AR scores in their brochures since an AR report will be run in the fall to see how students did.

We hope that your summer is full of joy and great reads!
