





KEY TERMS TO KNOW

#1 - Pre-requisite

As you get ready to take classes each year, some classes you must fulfill the pre-requisite class to be eligible.

#2 - Post-secondary Options

Post-secondary refers to your college, training and/or career plans after high school graduation.

Thinking about where you want to be in the future will help you make decisions about the courses you take in high school to achieve your future goals.

#3 - High School & Beyond Plan


The **High School and Beyond Plan** is designed to help students think about their future goals and how to accomplish them.

This includes exploring interests and career options, developing a course plan for high school, and exploring opportunities to develop skills.

Students start their plans in 8th grade and then revise them throughout high school based on their changing interests or goals.

#4 - Transcript

Your transcript is a paper summarizing your classes, grades, and cumulative GPA.



#5 - GPA

Based on the grades you earn each semester, your GPA or *Grade Point Average* is calculated.

This number indicates the average of the grades you receive

*Most schools use a point system from 0-4.

A = 4.0 points

A- = 3.7 points

B+ = 3.3 points

B = 3.0 points

B- = 2.7 points

C+ = 2.3 points

C = 2.0 points

C- = 1.7 points

D = 1.0 points

F = 0.0 points

#6 - Credit

For every class you pass each semester you receive 0.5 credit.



*In high school, you will need 24 credits total in 4-years to graduate.

#7 – Naviance Student

Available to all middle and high school students and families.

#8 - MS for HS Credit

Students can take middle school courses for high school credit. After the first semester of high school, these courses will appear on the official transcript.


Students can choose to keep or remove the grades and/or credits from the middle school courses on their high school transcript until the end of your junior year. Please make an appointment with your high school counselor to discuss the process.

#9 - Electives

Throughout high school you will take exploratory classes based on your personal interests called "elective" classes.

Names of the courses and descriptions are found in the course catalog.



#10 - Advanced Placement (AP)

Many colleges will award credit or waive requirements for demonstrated proficiency through the AP exams.

Students can begin taking AP courses as early as 9th grade.

*If you are interested in AP courses, also check out the AP Capstone program.




