Discover Ebey's Reserve: History for Fourth Graders

FREE GUIDED FIELD TRIPS! – Thanks

to a generous grant from the **National Park Foundation**, and in partnership with *Ebey's Landing National Historical Reserve* and *Island County Museum*, five different educational programs for 4th grade students are being offered, from **February through June, 2018**. Your field trip includes:

- **An Information packet** with topic background and suggested pre-visit activities to prepare your students for their visit.
- **Admission / Presentation fee waiver** for up to 28 students (\$125 value).
- **Transportation cost reimbursement** of \$2 per student for Title 1 Whidbey Island Schools, and \$8 per student from off-island Title 1 schools.
- **45-minute guided interpretive tour** by museum staff / docents.
- **Suggestions for post-visit class activities**. Students will receive historical photo postcards as part of a post-visit activity.

1. Prehistoric life and the Columbian Mammoths *at* Island County Museum.
2. Native American life *at* Ebey's Landing.
3. Early Island pioneer life *at* Sunnyside Cemetery or Jacob Ebey House.
4. Coupeville's maritime history *at* Coupeville Wharf and Island County Museum.
5. Early military history *at* Fort Casey State Park.
