Our Presenters

- **Dr. Michelle Price** Is superintendent of North Central ESD in Wenatchee, WA. Dr. Price has an extensive background as principal, classroom teacher and superintendent in the Tacoma, Soap Lake and Moses Lake School Districts. Most recently, in 2014-15 Dr. Price served as State President of the Washington Association of School Administrators (WASA) and is currently a member of the National Executive Committee of the American Association of School Administrators (AASA). Dr. Price holds advanced degrees from Central Washington University and a Doctoral Degree from Washington State University. Dr. Price bis a great advocate of servant leadership, and she was selected as 2017 Wenatchee Valley Educational Office Professionals (WVEOP) Administrator of the Year.
- **Dr. Ismael Vivanco** moved to the U.S. as a young child and worked as a migrant in fields until the age of 16. His experiences taught him the value of hard work and more notably, the importance of education. Dr. Vivanco has studied in the U.S., Mexico, and Spain. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Western WA University, Master's and teacher certification from Heritage University, and superintendent credentials and Doctorate of Education from WA State University. Ismael now serves as the Superintendent for Entiat and Palisades School districts. He currently serves as Regional President for the WA Association of School Administrators (WASA). Dr. Vivanco is very proud of his Mexican heritage, is committed to supporting and giving back to the community, and has been involved in several regional, state, and national organizations, as well as local programs and festivals. He was honored as NAEOP Administrator of the Year in 2015.
- Alexis Rowland is Senior Business Manager in the Boise State University College of Health Sciences. She supports the Dean, College of Health Sciences, and assists various departments and school in the College in budgetary matters, administration, human resources and customer service. Rowland came to Boise in 2002 after 17 years with UCLA where she was policy and training manager for the UCLA Academic Personnel Office and assistant to the Associate Vice Chancellor for Faculty Development/Diversity. Rowland spent her first seven years in the UCLA Payroll Office where she managed payroll processing and check distribution for over 30,000 staff, faculty, and student employees each month. Prior to coming to Boise State University, Rowland had the privilege of working at the Idaho State Veterans Cemetery, part of the team that took it from a simple hillside to 76 acres of a beautifully landscaped place of honor for Idaho Veterans and their spouses. Rowland was honored as 2015 Idaho AEOP Administrator of the Year and 2016 NAEOP Administrator of the Year.
- **Dr. Millie Watkins** recently retired from her position as superintendent of Orondo School District, where she served for 14 years. Prior to that she served 14 years as Director of Migrant Education, working for NW ESD 189 in Anacortes, WA, and North Central ESD in Wenatchee. She was a classroom teacher for five years at the beginning of her educational career. Dr. Watkins received her BA in Spanish Education from Southern Nazarene University; her master's from Eastern Washington University; and her doctorate from Washington State University. Millie was selected as 2009 WVEOP Administrator of the Year and 2009 WAEOP Administrator of the Year.
- **Dr. Gene Sharratt** is currently Executive Director for the Association of Educational Service Districts/OSPI Professional Learning Network. Prior to that, Dr. Sharratt served three years on Governor Inslee's Cabinet as Executive Director of the WA Student Achievement Council, the lead state agency bringing together all sectors of the state's education system, early learning through higher education, to improve access, attainment, and outcomes for all Washingtonians. Dr. Sharratt spent ten years as a clinical assistant and associate college professor for WA State University. He served 30 years as a K-12 teacher, principal, school superintendent, and ESD superintendent in international and public schools in WA, Alaska and Norway. Dr. Sharratt has published numerous articles in professional journals and magazines and is the author of *Keeping on your Feet*, an inspirational book of how to overcome challenges. He is the past president of the Washington Educational Research Association.
