4. Exciting STEM Opportunity for sophomores: <u>Western Aerospace Scholars Sophomore Program</u>

The WAS Sophomore program is a two-part program in which students complete online distance learning lessons in March with the goal of qualifying to participate in a 3-day (non-residential) summer experience.

The 2018 sophomore program application is available now and will be **due Friday**, **Feb. 16**. Phase One begins Tuesday, March 6, with assignments due every two weeks until April 3.

The WAS distance learning curriculum was developed in partnership with NASA and the University of Washington and focuses on the history of NASA and the space environment around the Earth, including its control by solar activity and the potential opportunities for human exploration of the solar system.

If they successfully complete the online curriculum, students are invited to participate in a 3-day summer experience that provides them to the opportunity to meet STEM professionals, NASA scientists, university students and STEM educators. Students who successfully complete the WAS Sophomore program are also given automatic admission into the WAS Junior program and have the ability to transfer their assignment scores into the junior program.

5. Civics essay and video contests | Deadline April 1

The Ninth Circuit is celebrating the 14th Amendment's 150th anniversary by sponsoring an essay and video contest for high school students which focuses on what "equal protection" means to students. Students can submit an essay or a video. Winners will receive \$2,000 for first place; \$1,000 for second place; \$500 for third place. Guidelines and submissions are online.

6. Calling all artists! During the <u>Edge of Amazing</u> Oct. 10 and 11 summit, approximately 400 community members will gather to learn how they can make Snohomish County a healthier place to live and work. The theme for 2018 is "A STAGE FOR CHANGE."
