Everett students earn top awards in Spanish literacy contest

This year's topic was "celebrating the diversity and richness of our culture" and students from 110 schools statewide participated and submitted 520 essays.



Jocelyn Ramirez was very excited, "I've never got a prize for writing poetry and this was a beautiful feeling and experience."
