- ❖ The adolescent **pertussis vaccine (Tdap)** is required for students in grades 6 through 9.

Recommended vaccines also are available.

- ❖ **Meningococcal** vaccine (one shot) is recommended for adolescents age 11 and older.
- ❖ A three-shot series of **human papillomavirus (HPV)** is recommended for girls age 11 and older and by parent request for boys of the same age to prevent two types of genital warts.
- ❖ Older teens should have one dose of the adolescent **pertussis** vaccine (Tdap).
- ❖ Children 12 months and older should receive **hepatitis A** vaccine, a two-shot series.
