Waggoner on April 28 with their first-ever
Lifetime Achievement Award. WSPRA
also honored Waggoner in 1997 with a
Learning and Liberty Award for her
contributions to the profession of school
public relations through her extensive
body of work, unique achievements,
collaboration with colleagues and
mentoring other school public relations
professionals.

Mary Waggoner has served as Everett Public Schools' director of communications since the spring of 2006.

She also worked as director of communications for the Wenatchee, Snohomish, and Issaquah school districts. Before working in school communications, she was a high school English teacher in Colorado, and held several communications related jobs in the private sector.

Waggoner's recognition comes on the horizon of her retirement. "My one-room-Colorado-schoolhouse-teacher-grandmother hooked me on reading and then on teaching decades ago. How the time has flown — and you know, it only does that when one is having fun. What a blessing it's been to have a supporting role in this important work of public education — and so many amazing teachers and mentors along the way," Mary shared.

Superintendent Cohn shared, "Under Mary's leadership we completely rebranded our district, jumped from legacy to state-of-the-art systems for keeping in constant contact with our public, and launched a multi-faceted community engagement effort that led to
