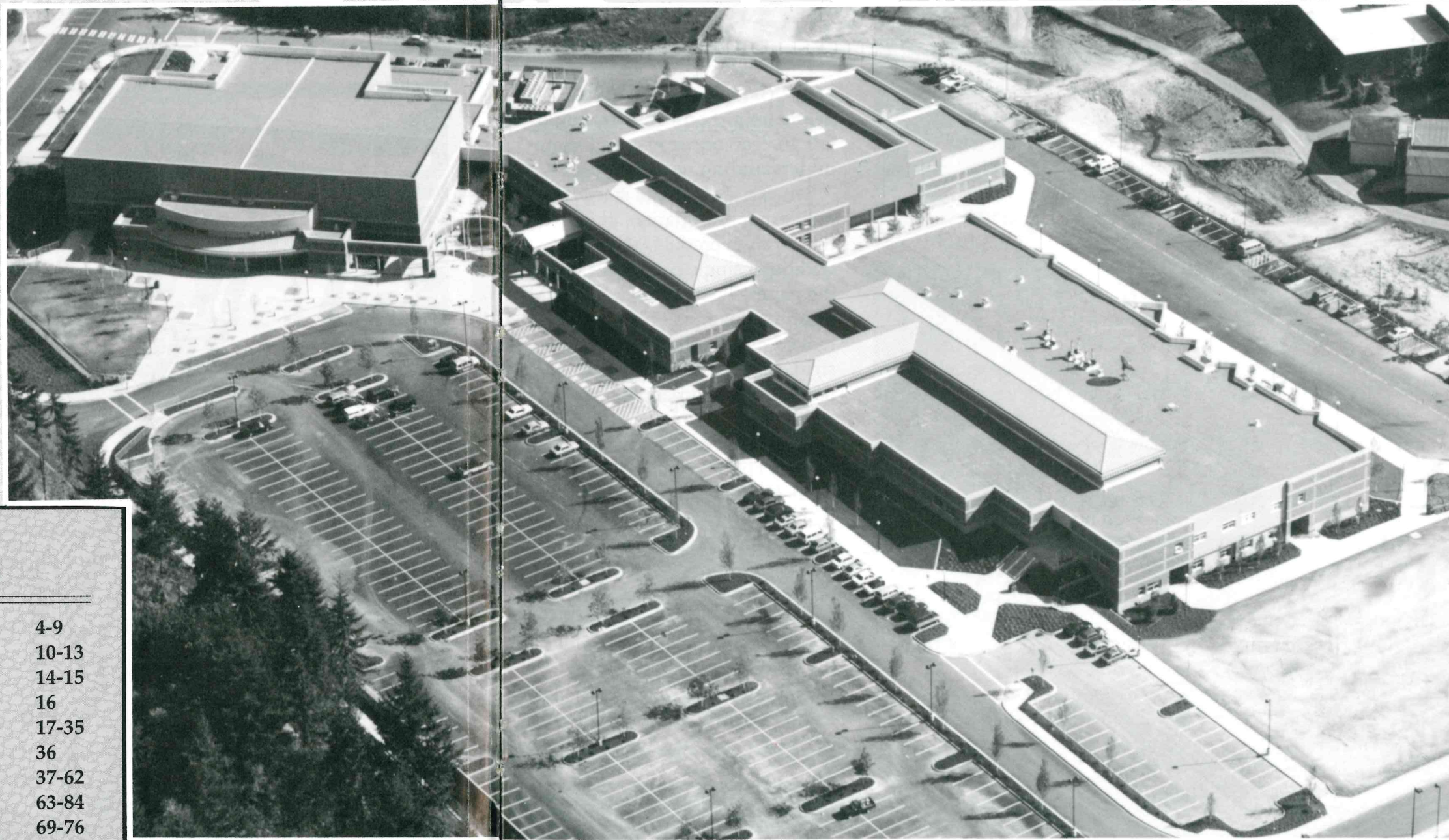

Dedication speech by Mary Boerger

I'm very honored to give this speech, a speech about an incredible man, Senator Henry M. Jackson. He did so many things in his life that I don't have time to name them all, but I can tell you a little bit about who he was, and what wonderful things he did for all of us.

Senator Jackson's achievements have been recognized by Presidents, colleagues and people from his home town.

In a memorial address given in the Senate, a colleague of Senator Jackson honored him by saying, "His is a life to celebrate, even as we mourn, and as we give good cheer in our hearts, may the echo linger."

This school is a part of that lingering echo.

I never met Senator Jackson, I was only three when he died. But, from what I've read and

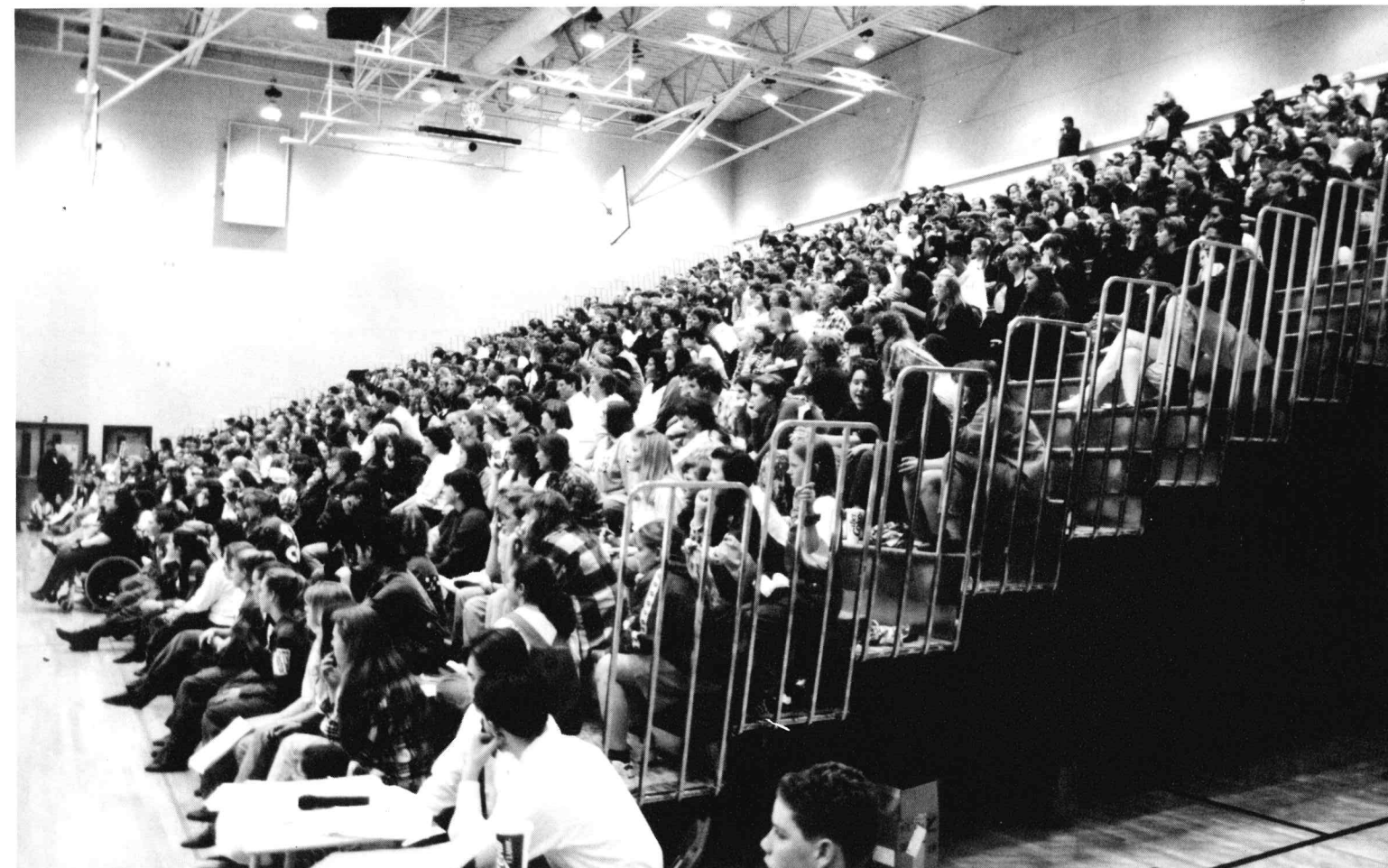
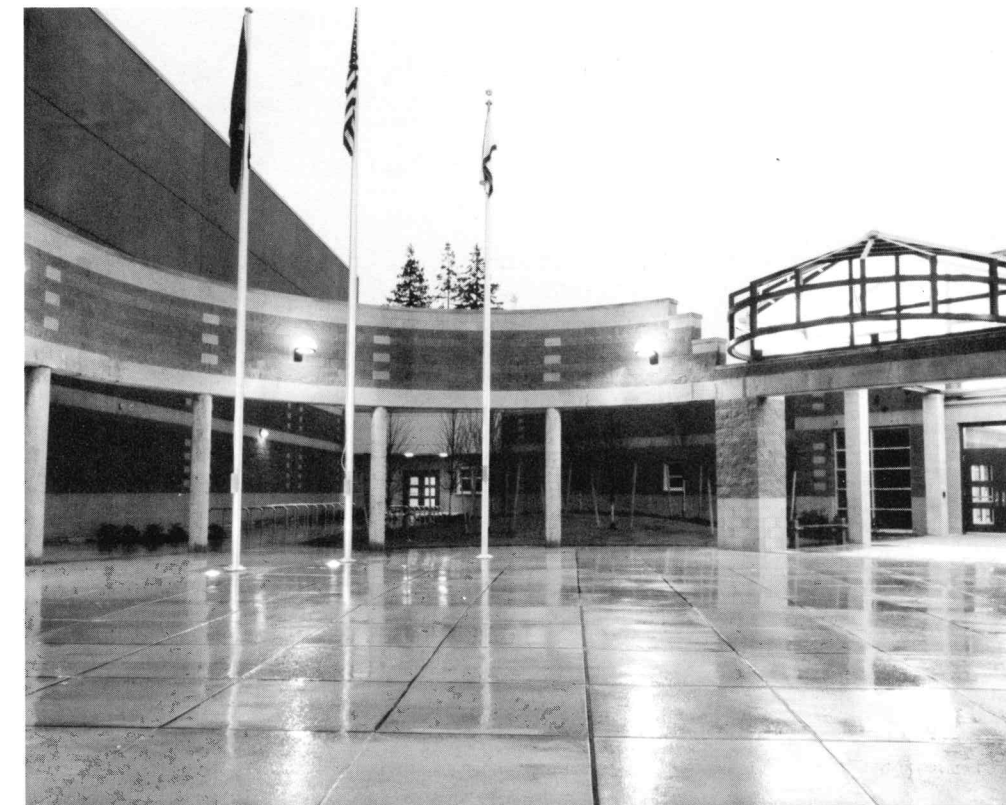
have been told, he was a kind, gentle man, Someone you could talk to, lean on, or just find some understanding with.

Senator Jackson got started by delivering newspapers. It is said that he delivered 84,000 papers without a single complaint. From the papers he delivered, he got his nickname. His sister thought he looked and acted like a comic strip character named Scoop, the name stuck and people have called him that ever since.

Senator Jackson graduated from Everett High School in 1930. Five years later he graduated from the University of Washington's Law Department. At the age of 26 he was elected to the prosecutor's office. He remained in public office until his death in 1983. As a Congressman he cared deeply for the western states, especially Washington. He was a marvelous leader, not only for Everett, but for the United States too. We can

learn a lot from Henry M. Jackson; PRIDE, LEADERSHIP, CARING, HONESTY.

The echo will never die; not after Henry M. Jackson died, not after all of us here are gone, not even after this school is just a fond memory. We may not remember his name, but the PRIDE, LEADERSHIP, CARING AND HONESTY he taught us will be a lingering echo in the hearts of all people FOREVER.

The ASB officers plan events including dances and pep assemblies. Another duty of the executive board is to manage funds for sports and activities as well as the yearbook.

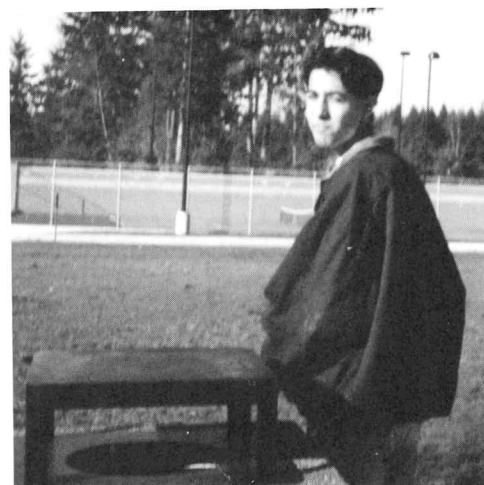
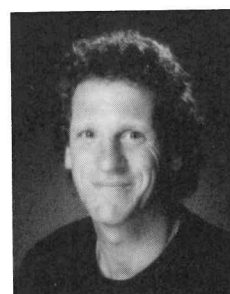

During June of 1994, representatives were selected from Cascade, Heatherwood and Eisenhower to develop the ASB format for Jackson High School. This group planned ASB activities until the beginning of this year when the current officers were elected and were responsible for writing the constitution.

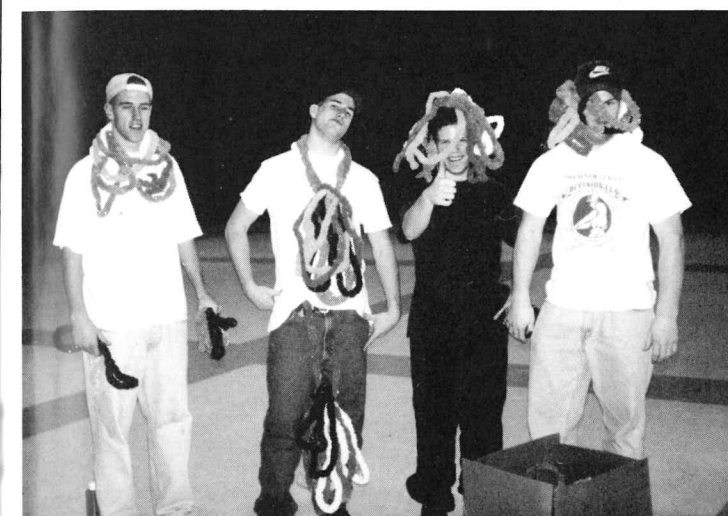
Some unique aspects of our constitution include the House of Representatives and the Senate.

The House of Representatives is made up of one representative from each Planning Team and the Senate is made up of one representative from each club or sport. Together, these groups help a bill become final.

Another unique aspect of our governance system is our officers. The positions of ASB Historian, Activities Coordinator and PTSA Representative are uncommon among most high school governments. Duties of ASB Historian include keeping an accurate record of all minutes and preserving reports from each meeting. The ASB Activities Coordinator is in charge of planning any activities and works with the Treasurer in order to plan fundraisers. Responsibilities of the PTSA Representative are to report to the PTSA on what happens at all government meetings and to attend all meetings.

Our constitution must be ratified by the student body every year for the next three years. After that, the constitution must be reviewed every four years. This allows each incoming class to review the constitution sometime during their high school term.

Some of the accomplishments of this year's ASB have been holding many pep assemblies and planning the winter formal. In the future, the ASB hopes to do an even better job at promoting school spirit and opening communication lines between the students and the ASB. The ASB also hopes to plan more events.

Sophomore Class Leadership

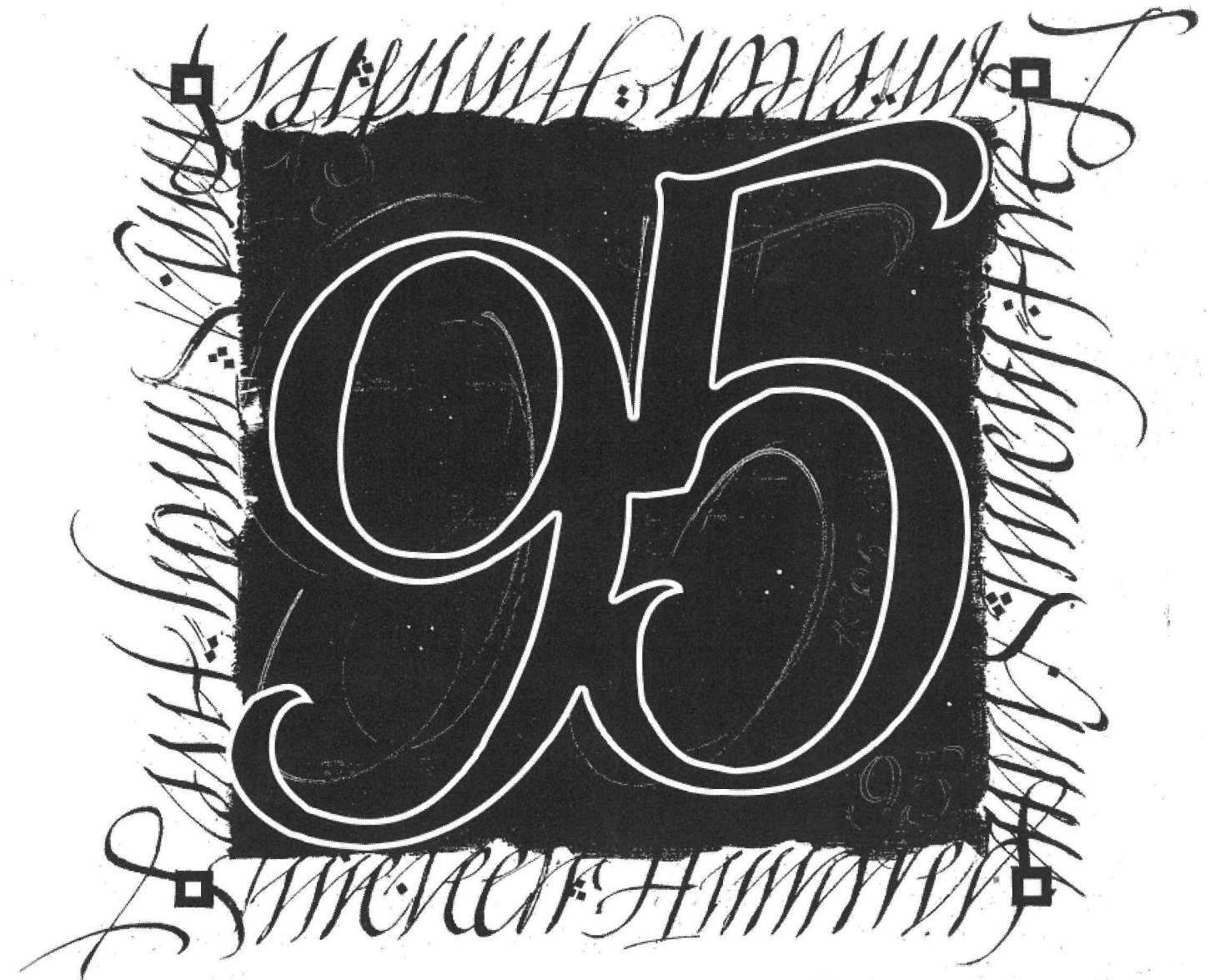

Freshmen Class Leadership

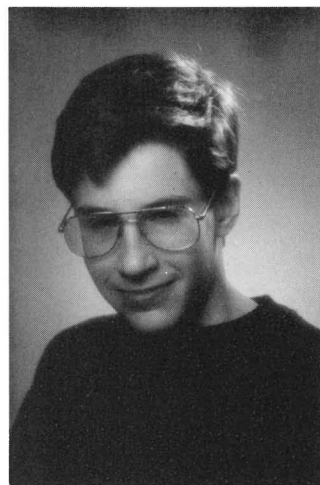
The Freshmen Class officers plan events for freshmen, build school spirit, and make money for the freshman class. This year one of their accomplishments was the three on three basketball tournament.

The Freshmen team made marked improvements in every game of the 94-95 campaign.

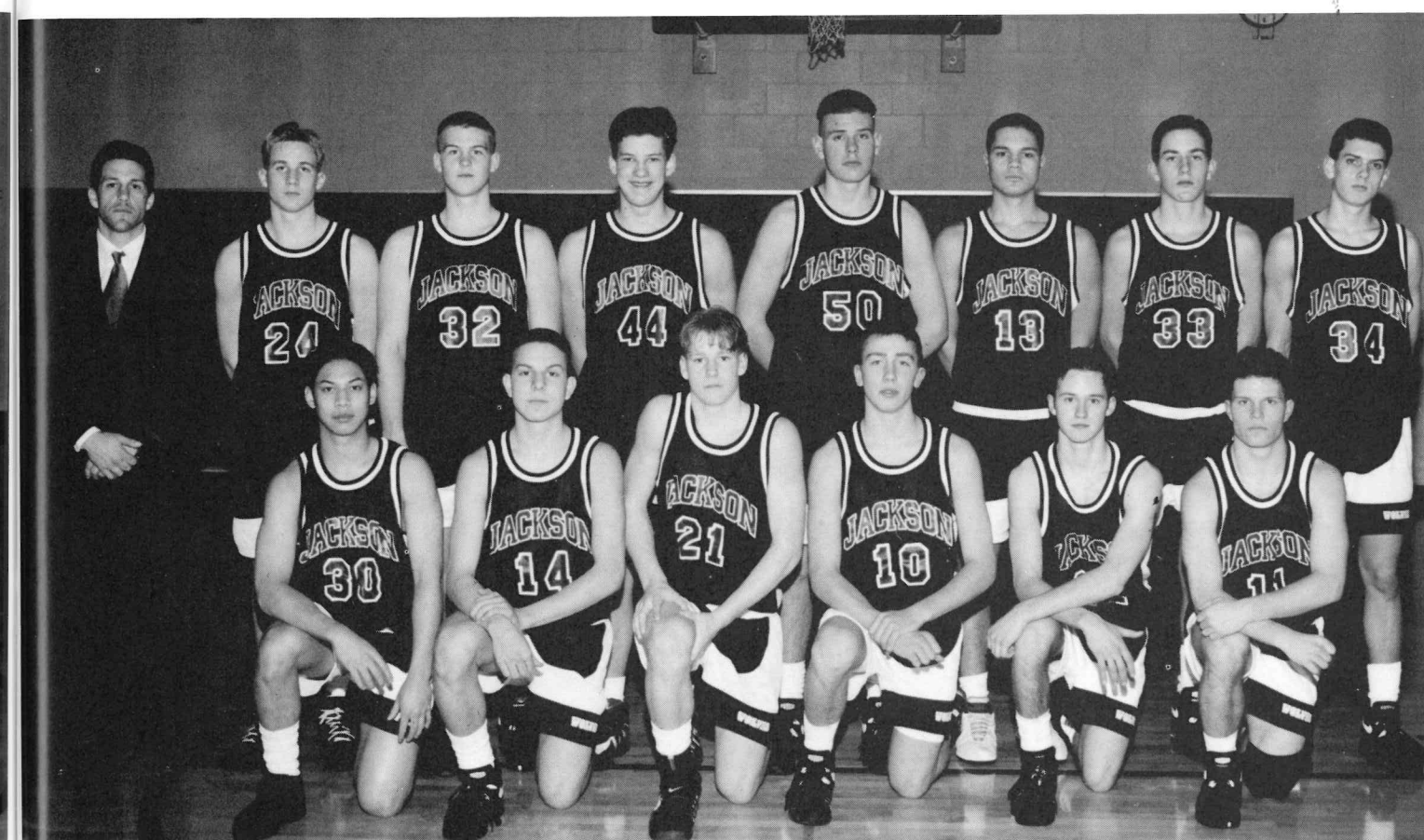

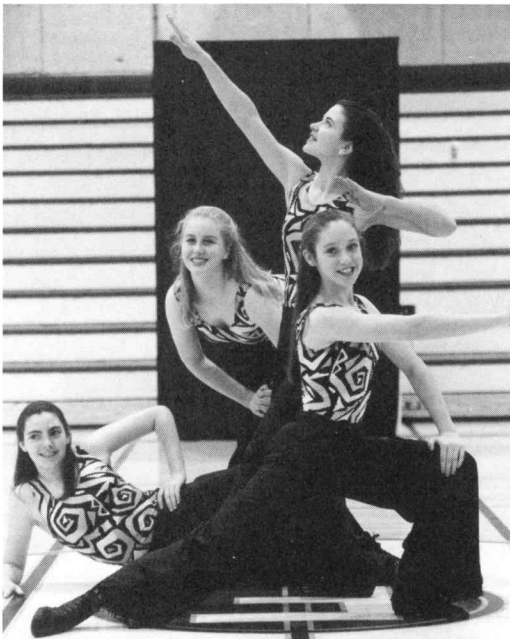
Jackson Dance Team provides an opportunity for students to be part of a competitive team that involves artistic expression as well as a physical workout.

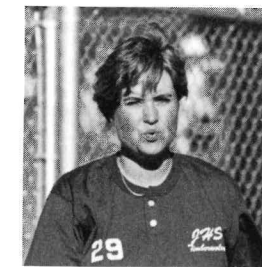
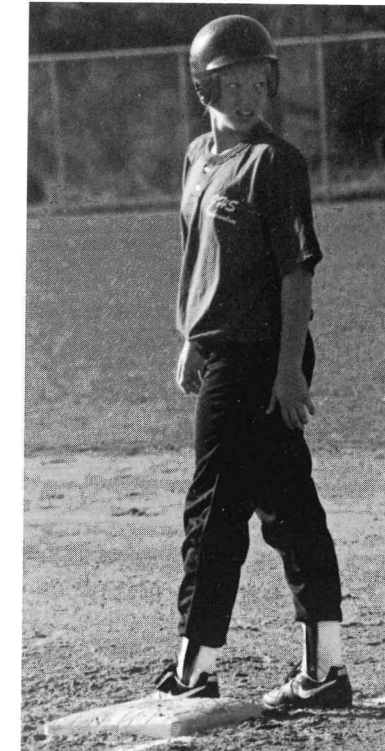
and sophomores; Mary Vranjin and Kirsten Jennings. On injured reserve is freshman backup pitcher and infielder Sarah Lundberg.

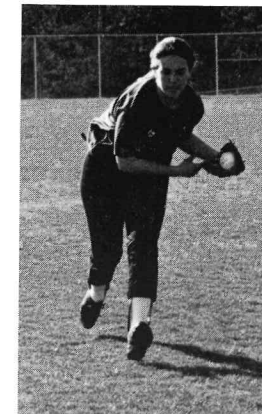
Each player has been committed to working hard and keeping a positive attitude, making the '95 season one of fun and continuous improvement.

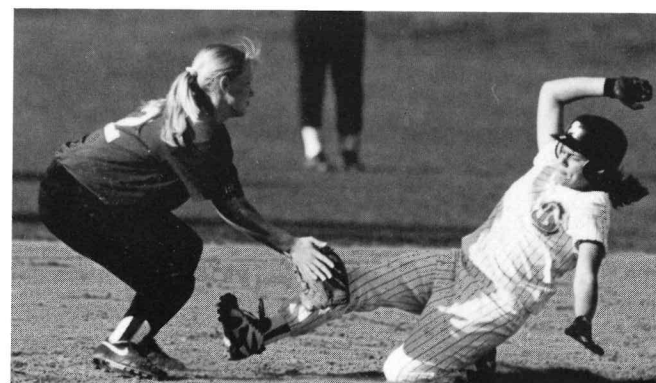
