- Lists any pre-requisite classes



To begin, click the **plus icon** to select your school and the **24 Credit High School Course Plan**.









Each time **select** classes for 12<sup>th</sup> grade, double-check the *course* and *grade level*.


To add, click **Add Selected Courses**button.
