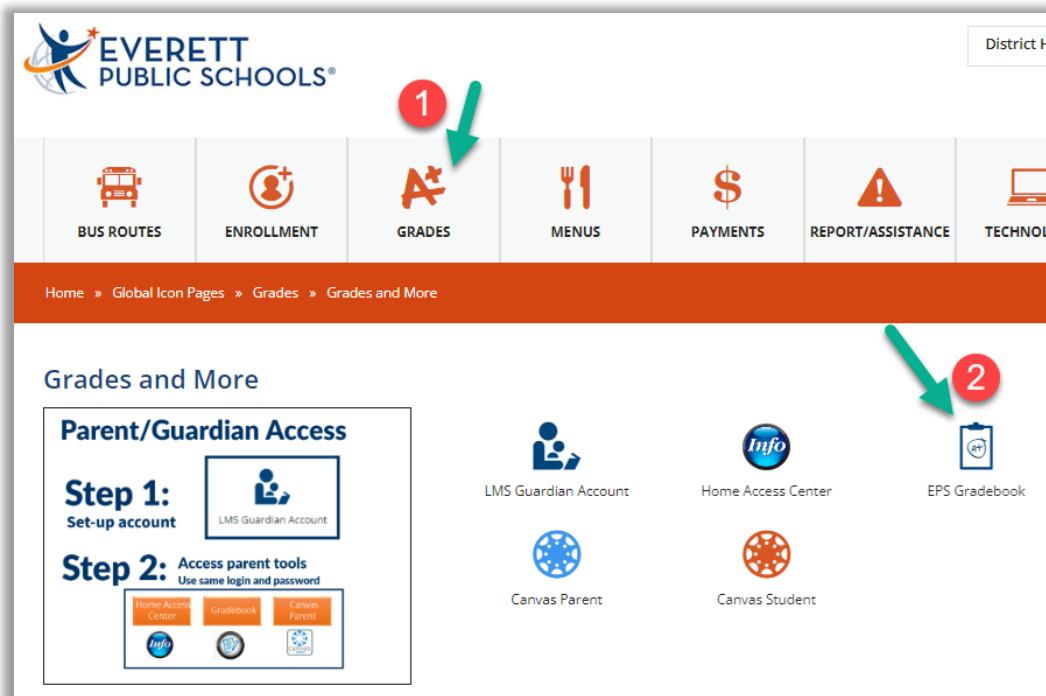


## Gradebook Navigation for Elementary Families (Kindergarten to Grade 5)

Parents of elementary students can access the Elementary Progress Reports at the end of each semester in Gradebook. If elementary teachers are using learning standards in assignments and quizzes, Gradebook offers parents and students online access to real-time information about how students are doing in school.

To sign into Gradebook, go to the Everett Public Schools' website: <https://www.everettsd.org/> and click on the **A+ Grades** tab. Click on the "[EPS Gradebook](#)" icon to see more information on Gradebook.

Students will log in using their computer/Chromebook account.





<p><b>Students menu</b> –If you are a student, you will only see your own information.</p> <p>If you are a parent and you have more than student in our district, you will see them in a list on the left. Clicking the student’s name will toggle the information to that specific student.</p> <p>If using a mobile device, you may need to go to the triple bar menu icon to see the menus.</p>

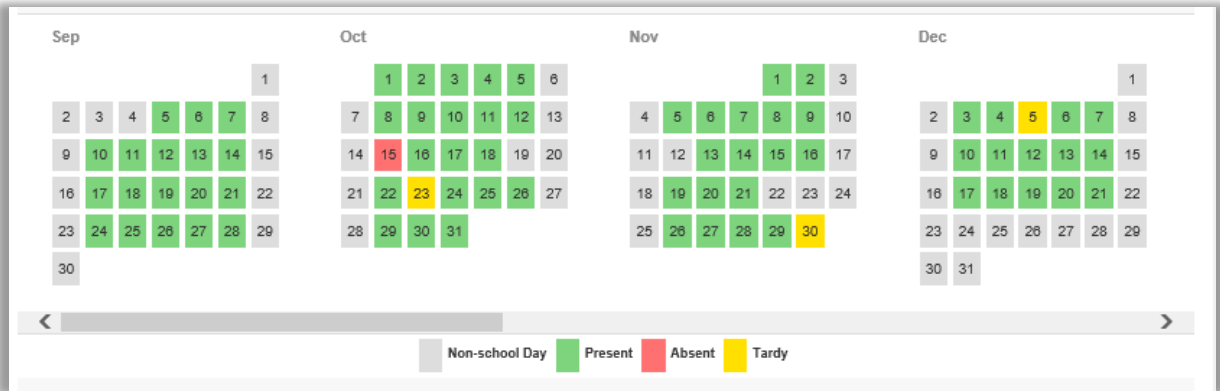

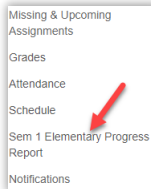


