

Penny Creek Attendance Corner

If your student is absent or tardy from school, please email the attendance office at <u>pceattendance@everettsd.org</u> to let us know the reason for the absence or tardy. There is also a direct link on our webpage at: https://www.everettsd.org/pennycreek

- Absences must be reported (by email or note) within 30 days after a
 student returns back to school, not including Holidays or weekends, in
 order to have the absence excused. Emails or notes turned in past the 30day timeframe will be accepted; however, the absence is not excused and
 will be coded as such.
- Automated attendance calls will be sent out daily at 10 a.m. If your student will be absent or tardy you must notify the office before 9:15 a.m.
 If it is reported after this time you may receive the automated call.
- Please view the <u>Everett School District Attendance Procedure 3122P</u> for more information (including definitions of absences).
- Did you have a medical appointment for your child, or they were sick, and you brought them to the doctor? If so, make sure to ask
 for a medical note from the provider. Email the note to the attendance office so those absences can be coded as a medical note
 excused absence.
- Please fill out a <u>Prearranged Absence Form</u> if your student will be going on vacation/traveling or will miss school for an extended
 period of time. As per district policy, the principal or designee may excuse up to five (5) school days for a prearranged absence per
 student each school year.



Checking out a Penny Creek student during the school day

Sometimes it is necessary for a parent/guardian to pick up a student before Penny Creek's dismissal time. To help us prepare, please send a note or email the school office at PennyCreek@everettsd.org in advance, letting us know the specific date, time and who will be picking up your child. Students who are dismissed during the school day, must be signed out from the school office by their parent/guardian (or adult designee) before leaving the school grounds. If an adult designee is coming to check out your child, a note or email to the school office at PennyCreek@everettsd.org must be submitted by the guardian to confirm. Students will be called from the classroom for dismissal once the parent/guardian (or adult designee) arrives at the office. For the safety and security of students, we will ask for photo identification.



Changes to a student's daily going home plan

Occasionally, you may need to change the plan of how your child is going home at the end of the school day. If this is the case for your family, we ask that a guardian sends an email to the school office at PennyCreek@everettsd.org and the classroom teacher by 2:45 pm. Please include the name of your student, their teacher, and the change of plan. Our office will then deliver this information to your student. This method of communication helps to support our staff with accurate dismissal information.

News from our PCE Librarian, Mrs. Kim Woodrum

Hello Parents/Guardians of Penny Creek readers!

Here are a few updates that would help you support your students' library and reading experience.

2022-2023 Book Checkout Policy:

Books can be checkout out for two weeks. They can also be renewed for an additional two weeks.

Kindergarten Grade – 1 book each visit starting the week of October 3 First Grade – 1 book during semester 1 and 2 books during semester 2 Second Grade – 2 books

Third Grade – 3 books Fourth Grade – 3 books Fifth Grade – 3 books

<u>Volunteers:</u> With the size of our school, the number of books rotating each week is quite impressive. The means extra hands helping check books in and reshelving is needed. If you are interested in volunteering in the library, either weekly or every other week, please let me know. My greatest need is from 9:15-10:15 a.m. while all the books are being returned.

Checking your student's account:

The system we use for cataloguing school library books is called Follett Destiny. Students can access this from school *and* from home. Students launch the program from the student tools on the district or school website. Once logged in, you and your student can see what books are currently checked out under their name.

Battle of the Books: Tuesday, October 4 from 3:30-4:30 p.m., will be the first Battle of the Books meeting for interested 3-5 grade students. We will also meet the following Tuesday, October 11 then will transition to monthly meetings through April. Our "Battle" will be in May (date TBD), hopefully coordinated with our school's Family Literacy Night. The Battle of the Books book list can be found on our school website under the Library tab. We have copies of most books, but not enough for the number of students currently signed up. In addition to our PCE library, please reach out to the local public libraries. 

Parent University



Safety reminders

As mornings become darker and darker, drivers, please keep an eye out for students walking and waiting at their bus stops. Families, please have your students wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and the flashing lights and stop sign to be fully out before they cross the street. Here is great graphic showing when to stop for school buses, and if you are ever in doubt--STOP! Other safety reminders include:

- Students and parents should wait on the curb when waiting for the school bus, not off
 the curb or in the street.
- Do not stand in school crosswalks, obey crossing guards if present.
- Be focused and aware when walking in school parking lots. We encourage walkers to stay off their cell phones while walking. Dark mornings may make it difficult for drivers to see walkers.
- Bicyclist must abide by the same laws as drivers, which means they must stop for school buses when applicable.
- If possible, wear lighter clothing/coats or add something reflective on darker clothing.



Did you miss a call from us?

If you missed a call from your school, please first check your voice mail, email or mobile app for the message rather than calling the school. Schools are often inundated with phone calls from parents after they send an automated call and cannot answer all the calls. If messaging is still not being delivered, then you will need to update your contact information at your school. If your contact information has changed, please let your school know so they can update the system to be able to successfully reach you.



Parent University (Universidad para Padres)



Recordatorios de seguridad

Ahora que las mañanas se están haciendo más oscuras, le pedimos por favor a los conductores que tengan precaución con los estudiantes que están caminando y esperando en las paradas de autobús. Familias, por favor hagan que sus estudiantes se esperen a que el autobús se pare por completo, destelle sus luces intermitentes y despliegue la barra de alto por completo antes de cruzar la calle. Aquí les presentamos una gráfica que muestra cuando detenerse ante los autobuses escolares. Y si tiene duda--iDETÉGANSE! Otros recordatorios de seguridad incluyen:

- Los estudiantes y los padres deben esperar en la acera cuando esperen el autobús escolar y no abajo de la banqueta o en el arroyo vehicular.
- No se paren en los cruces escolares, obedezca a los guardias de cruce cuando estén presentes.
- Enfóquese y esté alerta al caminar en los estacionamientos escolares. Exhortamos a las personas que caminan que no estén distraídos con sus celulares al ir caminando. Las mañanas oscuras pueden producir dificultades para que los conductores puedan ver a los peatones.
- Los ciclistas deben apegarse a las mismas leyes que los conductores, lo que significa que deben pararse ante los autobuses escolares cuando aplique.
- Si es posible, use ropa/abrigos ligeros reflectivo sobre la ropa oscura.



¿Tiene una llamada perdida de nosotros?

Si tiene una llamada perdida de su escuela, primero verifique su correo de voz, email o aplicación móvil para el mensaje, en lugar de llamar a la escuela. Las escuelas están a menudo inundadas con llamadas de los padres después de recibir una llamada automatizada y no pueden responder a todas las llamadas. Si no le están llegando los mensajes, entonces tendrá que actualizar su información de contacto en su escuela. Si su información de contacto ha cambiado, por favor, avise a su escuela para que puedan actualizar el sistema y poder contactarlo.
