Did you know there are over 800 students currently enrolled in our schools who qualify as a 'Kid in Transition' (KIT)? They either don't know where they will sleep tonight, are doubled-up with another family, in a temporary shelter, living in a car or in another unstable

home situation.

There are also over 100 kids in our high schools who are unaccompanied homeless youth (UHY) which means they are not in the care of a parent or legal guardian. 
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All Together Now! Everett High



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Signs of student substance use and misuse

As educators, we understand that a certain amount of risk-taking is a normal part of adolescent development. The desire to try new things and become more independent is healthy, but it may also increase teens' tendencies to experiment with drugs and alcohol.

Because the teenage brain is still developing, substance use at this age has more potential to disrupt brain function in areas critical to memory, learning, judgment, and
