

College in the High School Application

Everett Public Schools has established interlocal agreements with Everett Community College (EvCC), Edmonds College (EC), and the University of Washington in the High School (UWHS) to offer College in the High School (CiHS) for some courses taught by qualified high school teaching staff.

To become a CiHS teacher, please complete the application below. **To review teachers and courses currently approved for CiHS, please check HERE.** If a teacher and a course are currently on this list, there is no need to re-apply. However, each institution may have a process for re-approval, especially if last approval was three years ago or longer.

It is important to note that if a teacher and course are approved as CiHS by more than one college or university that CiHS courses may not be combined between institutions within the same course section. For example, in a Spanish IV CiHS class, college credit can only be offered through EvCC, EC or UWHS. The class cannot be offered for CiHS credit through multiple colleges or universities for the same class period.

CiHS must be approved by the college AND by the district. A teacher must be approved for each course.
