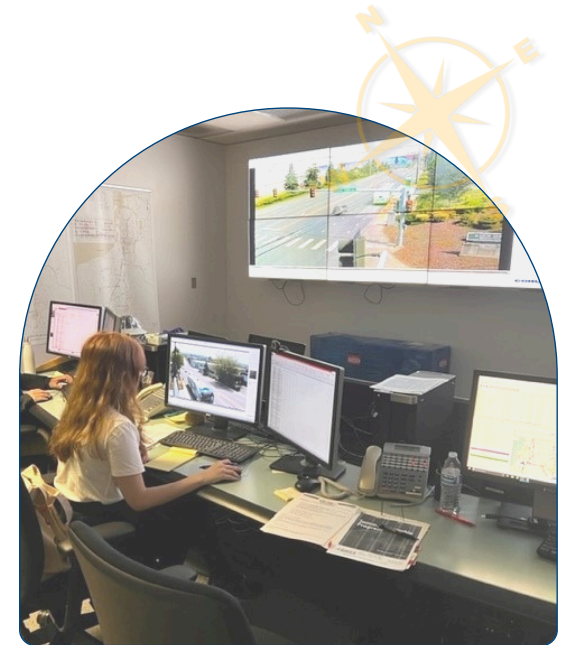
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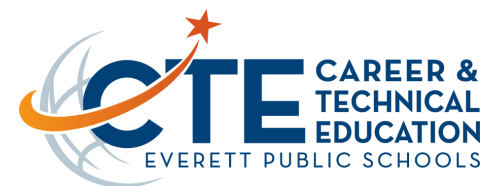

EXPLORATION (.5 CTE CREDIT)

Current students in grades 8 and 9.

This program is virtual with synchronous zooms 2-3 times per week from July 10 - 28.

Students:

- 1 look at opportunities in career clusters that are aligned with their abilities, interests and personalities.
- 2 formulate academic and career goals while creating a plan for future achievement.
- 3 benefit from additional guidance prior to entering high school.

MENTORSHIP (.5 CTE CREDIT)

Current students in grades 10 and 11.

This program is virtual with synchronous zooms 2-3 times per week from July 10 - 28.

Students:

- 1 take an in-depth look at career opportunities that are aligned with their abilities, interests and personalities to formulate academic and career goals.
- 2 work closely with an industry mentor to discuss solutions and ideas.
- 3 apply problem-solving, collaboration, project management, human relations, presentation and networking skills.

INTERNSHIP (.5 CTE CREDIT)

Current students in grade 11 (students who are 16 years old in grade 10 can apply).

This program provides a 90-hour in-person summer internship which runs from the end of June through the end of July.

Students:

- 1 are linked with a local business for a 90-hour summer internship.
- 2 are given the chance to "learn before they earn" by experiencing what it is like to work in a specific job or work environment while earning credit.

Career exploration, mentorships and internships are FREE and provide students with the opportunity to access knowledge of the pathways and skills needed for fulfilling careers, while also providing local industries the opportunity to address workforce needs by working with potential future employees.
