

- •Associate in Arts and Sciences Direct Transfer Agreement: The designated transfer degree, accepted by many institutions in Washington and Oregon.
- •Associate of Science: Designed for transfer to selected Washington universities in science majors
- •Associate in Business DTA: Designed for transfer to Washington institutions for business and accounting majors
- •Associate in Applied Science Transfer: Computer Information Systems
- •Associate in Technical Arts: Offered in a wide variety of professional, technical and occupational fields
- •Associate in Fine Arts: Interdisciplinary program including visual, studio and performing arts
- •Associate in General Studies: Combines a variety of courses selected by the student

- · EvCC will ONLY process your placement if you submit at least one approved document.

Submit at least one document listed from either Category A, B, or C.

Category A: Unofficial High School Transcripts & Progress Reports

High School Transcript English Placement Cumulative 2.5 GPA or higher for the following student groups: WA State High school graduate within the last 5 years; WA State High School Senior currently in your second semester; Running Start Applicant Math Placement An approved math course within the last 2 years with a grade of C+ or higher in both semesters. A "C" or "C-" grade does not meet the qualification. Algebra II within the last 3 years with a grade of C or higher in both semesters. High School Progress Report Provide a high school progress report if your second semester math grade is not posted on the high school transcript. The progress report needs to include the current second semester grade.



DIRECTED SELF PLACEMENT ENGLISH ASSESSMENT

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE DIRECTED SELF PLACEMENT

- Directed Self Placement helps assess confidence in reading, writing, and revision.
- Students self assess readiness to study English
- It usually takes students about one hour to complete. However, it is not timed
- The Holistic Assessment rubrik helps to select most successful English Placement
- You cannot fail!



ACCUPLACER MATH ASSESSMENT

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE ACCUPLACER:

- It costs \$33.70
- We have three testing options available.
 - Accuplacer via Zoom
 - Accuplacer via Drop-In In-Person
 - Accuplacer via Pre-paid In-Person appointments
- It usually takes students about 1 ½ 2 hours to complete. However, **it is not timed**, so make sure to plan for what you think you will need
- You cannot fail! The Accuplacer is just a tool to help you figure out which classes are the best match for your skill set
- You will get your results immediately

Financial Aid

2025-2026 Academic Year Priority Processing Dates:

Fall 2025 June 6, 2025

Benefits of Meeting the Priority Processing Date:

Tuition Postponement Hold: If you meet the priority processing date, you may be eligible for a tuition postponement hold, allowing you to remain registered for your classes while your financial aid is processed.

Ways to Pay for College

What Happens if You Miss the Priority Date? Don't worry—you can still apply for financial aid! However:

- Late Files: Applications completed after the priority date may not be reviewed until after the quarter begins.
- Planning Ahead: Be prepared to cover your educational expenses upfront while your aid is being reviewed.
- Retroactive Aid: If you qualify for grant aid, it will be applied retroactively for the quarter(s) you were eligible.


Tuition & Fees | First Year

Steps for Applying

- Explore the Educational Pathways to find the best fit for you.
- Create a User Name and Password for the Online Application Account Portal (OOAP).
- Begin the OOAP Application by selecting intended start date, Program of Interest, and Degree or Certificate of choice.
- Complete the OOAP by filling in the needed personal information.



Acceptance letters are emailed to applicants in 3-5 business day. Acceptance Letters include the Student's ctcLink ID (Student ID) and steps to activate their ctcLink Account.
