Construction glossary of terms

- Heating Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC a collection of equipment that provides heating, cooling, and fresh air systems that hopefully keep you warm when it's cold outside and cool when it's hot outside
- Hydronic loop usually welded steel, copper, or grooved lock piping that transports water intended to provide heating or cooling
- Variable Frequency Drives (VFD) electronically controls the speed of pump and fan motors in HVAC systems to increase energy efficiency and improve comfort
- Gypsum Wall Board (GWB) better known as drywall or sheetrock
- Concrete Masonry Units (CMU) concrete blocks
- Perforated Pastry Units (PPU) donuts and other pastries that are supplied at regularly held meetings between the architect, owner and contractor
- Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) fire marshal, building inspector or other official with responsibility to implement codes and ordinances



Woodside ES Modernization update

Woodside Elementary School is in the final phase of construction and is on track to complete in April 2021. Building G, the new administration and library building, and Buildings A and B, both classroom buildings, are complete and occupied by staff. Building D, which includes the gymnasium, music room, stage, cafeteria, kitchen, and multipurpose room was recently completed. Building C, the final classroom building is well into construction and is scheduled to complete in early March. Work on the covered play structure (Bldg. F) and installation of the new playground equipment was recently completed. Much of the concrete paving and sidewalks are complete, with the remaining areas scheduled for completion by early March. Finally, the project will wrap up with the restoration of the play field as the contractor moves their temporary facilities off the playfield in the coming months.



Custodial Services

Inclement Weather Prep: Snow Blowers have been serviced and delivered to sites. Please remember to submit a work order for grounds to deliver fresh gas for your machines. Prepare your spreaders so you can put out deicer when needed and submit a work order for additional deicer before you run out.

Focus of the Month: For December custodians shall focus on cleaning entrances to meet standards; dusting through-out the facility (including air vents) and replacing HVAC filters as required.

Health department quick tips: TAKE CARE OF YOUR BODY!

Be mindful about your physical health:

- Get enough sleep. Go to bed and get up at the same times each day. Stick close to your typical schedule, even if you're staying at home.
- Participate in a regular physical activity. Regular physical activity and exercise can help reduce anxiety and improve mood. Find an activity that includes movement, such as dance or exercise apps. Get outside in an area that makes it easy to maintain distance from people, such as nature trail or your own backyard.





- **Relax and recharge.** Set aside time for yourself. Even a few minutes of quiet time can be refreshing and help to quiet your mind and reduce anxiety. Many people benefit from practices such as deep breathing, tai chi, yoga or meditation. Soak in a bubble bath, listen to music, or read/listen to a book—whatever helps you relax. Select a technique that works for you and practice it regularly.
- **Limit screen time.** Turn off electronic devices for some time each day, including 30 minutes before bedtime. Make a conscious effort to spend less time in front of a screen—television, tablet, computer and phone.

Did you know? ISSA (International Service Standards Cleaning Association) studies find that it takes 50 seconds to clean a vent by damp wiping with a spray bottle and cloth while using a ladder. While changing filters, this is a good time to clean vents!



Resource Conservation

Energy use in the district for 2019-20 school year saw an overall reduction of 14%. This reduction is the result of several factors. Each year the maintenance department identifies 3 to 5 district sites with the highest energy usage. We conduct an audit of each site to determine our course of action then working with the site HVAC mechanic to make the necessary repairs and adjustments to the HVAC system. The results of these repairs and adjustments directly impacted energy usage as we in the 2019-20 school year. The successful reduction of energy usage was the result of heating and cooling schedule modifications; based on occupancy in addition to the heightened focus on preventative maintenance. Other contributing factors included LED conversions as well as plumbing audits and leak repairs. Due to COVID, occupancy schedules were adjusted, and our after-hours facility use eliminated which also reduced our energy costs. In 2020-21, we are continuing to examine our systems and make adjustments to conserve energy and reduce costs.


