- Ask your school to link all of your students in one account.

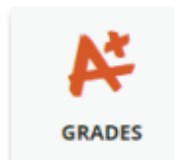

Stay informed!!! Activate your LMS parent/guardian account now!

The Learning Management Services (LMS) team is a service group within the Learning and Information Technology Services (LITS) department providing families support in utilizing our district applications for information management and instructional access. LMS applications offer parents and students secure online access to student information. With just a few clicks, you can stay informed about [student progress](#) or examine [unofficial transcripts and test scores](#).



What can I use my parent account for?

LMS parent/guardian accounts allow parents to access to the following systems:

	Home Access Center (HAC) This system allows parents and students to access basic demographic information, attendance, current year report cards (gr 6-12), transcripts (gr 7-12), discipline, view IEP plan, as well as view transportation information. Parents will also be able to access links within HAC to: • Enroll a new student • Complete the Annual Student Information Update Form Secondary students will be able to: • Request next year's courses each Spring
	Gradebook This system allows parents & students to view information in real-time, such as current grades, assignments, and attendance. Parents & students can set up weekly notifications in Gradebook to alert them for missing assignments or falling grades*. *Notifications preferences must be reset each semester as the notifications are tied to specific semester schedules.
	Canvas This system is used by teachers to deliver course content, organize online resources, host online discussions. Parent accounts allow parents to login in as an observer to their student(s) within the platform. Parents will be able to view content, message teachers, help their student stay on track. * Parents will also receive notifications from Canvas for Announcements, Assignments, Discussions, Calendar reminders, etc
	District App The app allows parents to have all their online resources and communications in one hub. Parents can manage their district communications here. By default, parents will receive messages in the format of phone, email and text. Within the app, parents can set a preference*. *Parents must have at least one method of communication, they cannot remove all modes.

How do I get a login/password?

Email the LMS team at LMS@everettsd.org with your name, student name(s), student ID# and/or DOB and school they attend. We will respond with your login/password by email. Our system will only send information to the email on file with the school.

R -- Respect Yourself & Others (be respectful)

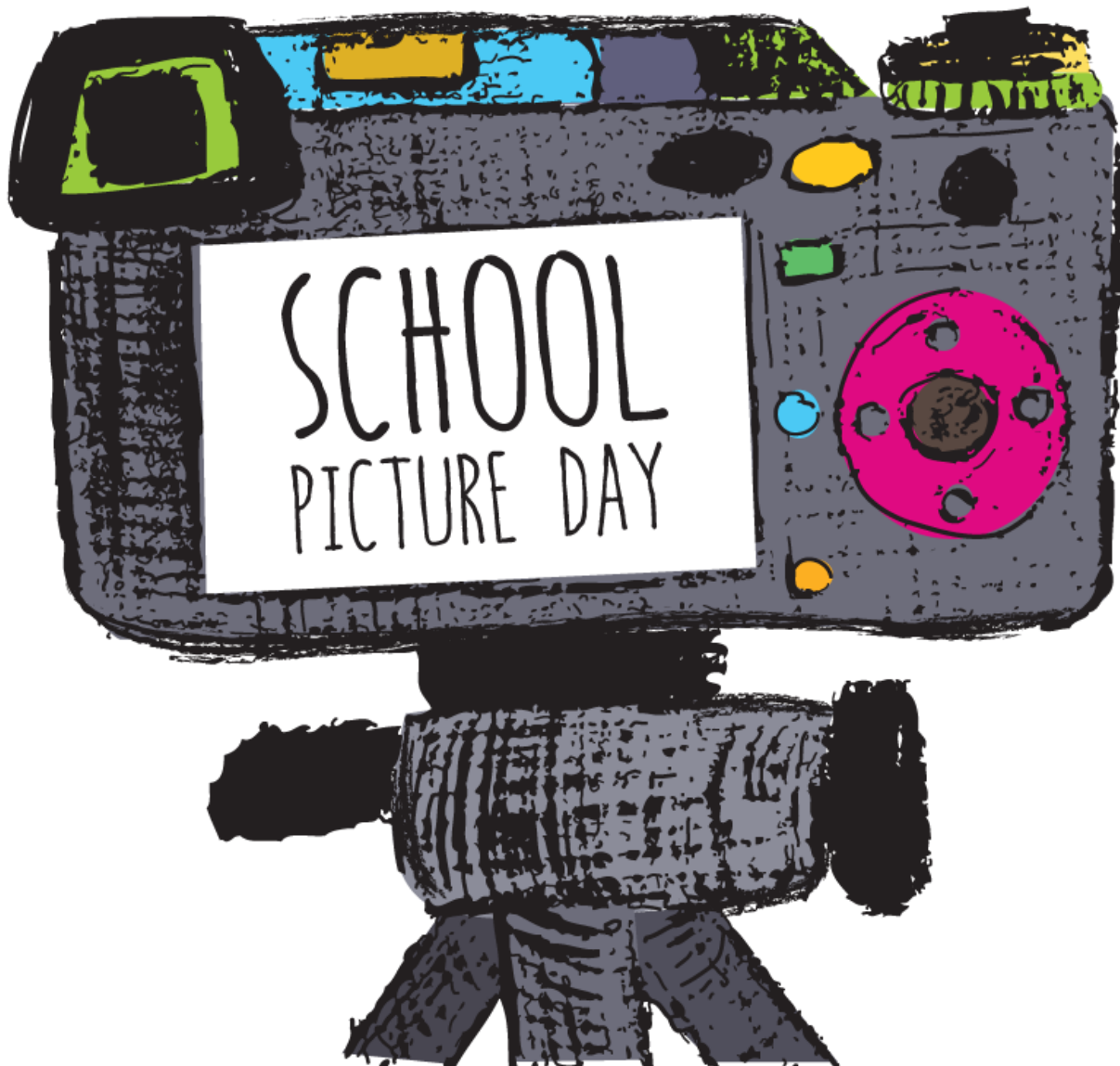

Big changes with school meals for 2022-23



There are big changes happening with school meals for the 2022-23 school year that are important for you to understand. As we continue to return to 'normal,' the USDA is no longer able to extend the 'free meals for all' waiver we have appreciated the last two school years.

However, our state recently passed a new bill that eases the transition, called the Community Eligibility Provision, or CEP for short. CEP is a free meal service option for schools and school districts who have a 40 percent or higher number of students who qualify for free and reduced lunch.

Everett Public Schools worked hard to group the largest number of schools possible that kept the average percentage above the program threshold and because of this, 18 of our schools qualify for this program, including our school.

This means that breakfast and lunches are free to all students at these schools, regardless of free and reduced lunch qualifications. Families at these schools will fill out a household income report, which has been emailed directly to you, in place of the free and reduced lunch application. This report is important to provide students access to free waivers and other services.

We are so excited to be able to use this new program to offer free meals to the students in our district who may need some extra support and to all of our students, no matter where they learn, we will continue to offer nutritious and delicious meals that include seasonal fresh fruits and vegetables, scratch-made whole grain foods and lean proteins, with vegetarian and gluten free options too.

There has never been a better time to eat school meals. We look forward to serving you soon.

Community Transit free to youth 18 and under

Starting September 1, youth 18 and under can ride all Community Transit services for free. That includes buses, DART paratransit service and vanpools (if they belong to a vanpool). Teens aged 13-18 are strongly encouraged to get a Youth ORCA card to use for fare "payment." Community Transit will be providing them at our high schools before school starts and middle schools when they get further shipments. If email is not possible, and even if you leave a message with the school attendance line, please send a written note to the school office within 30 days after your student returns to school.

SBA preliminary scores released

Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) student preliminary scores are available for families & students in the online Home Access Center (HAC). Families will also receive a hard copy in September.

How do I get the test scores? Under Quick Links, click How to view SBA scores for instructions. If you don't have a HAC account or have questions, contact LMS@everettsd.org.



Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science scores will be released in September. They will be put in HAC as soon as they arrive, and Individual Student Score Reports will be sent home through the normal school channels.



Access your family's immunization information

To access your family's immunization information from the Washington State registry visit, sign up for [MyIR](#) to view, download and print your student's immunization records securely online. Once you register, you can access the records anytime you need them. You can print your child's Certificate of Immunization Status for school, childcare and camp programs.

ECEAP preschool accepting applications for 2022-23

Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families.

The six ECEAP sites within our school district are Cedar Wood, Hawthorne, Jackson, Lowell, Madison, and Silver Lake elementary schools. We have both school-day classroom schedules and half-day (AM and PM) classroom schedules, depending on the school location. Space is limited – apply early! Kids in Transition program



Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify for two federal programs which provide support for children and youth whose housing is highly mobile: those who meet the more inclusive definition of homeless under the federal [McKinney-Vento Homeless Act](#) and those who are eligible for [Foster Care Education support](#).

Students who are in foster care placement (where a child welfare agency has placement, care and authority) or those who are without a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence may qualify for this additional support.

The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success and extra-curricular involvement. We ensure eligible students have access to free school meals, school supplies and uniforms. KIT may help students access extended day or summer school classes or coordinate access to additional academic support or tutoring when needed. The KIT Program may also cover, or coordinate



waivers for, fees required to take part in activities such as school-sponsored sports, clubs, and required class fees. KIT can also help set up transportation for eligible students to maintain school stability, as long as the commute is feasible and in the best interest of the student. We also partner with the Family Resource Center and other community agencies to connect families and students to resources as needed.

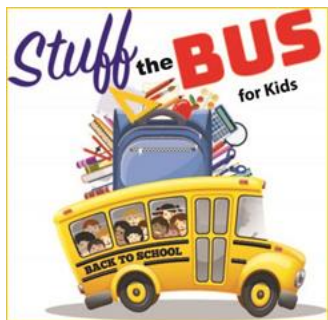

If there is reason for concern about safety on a designated walkway to school, call 9-1-1 immediately for authorized, quick help. We have strong partnerships with local law enforcement

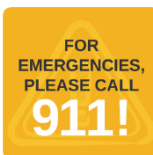

Staff members are required to maintain confidentiality of all information in a student's records. Grandes cambios en las comidas escolares en 2022-23



Es importante que comprenda los grandes cambios que tendrán lugar en las comidas escolares en el año escolar 2022-23. A medida que regresamos a la “normalidad”, el USDA (Departamento de Agricultura de los Estados Unidos) ya no puede prorrogar la exención de “comidas gratuitas para todos” de la que disfrutamos los dos últimos años escolares.

Sin embargo, nuestro estado recientemente aprobó una nueva ley que facilita la transición que se denomina la Disposición de Elegibilidad Comunitaria, o CEP por sus siglas en inglés. La CEP es una opción de servicio de comidas gratuitas para las escuelas y distritos escolares que tienen un 40% o más de alumnos que

califican para almuerzo gratuito o a precio reducido.

Las Escuelas Públicas de Everett trabajaron con gran dedicación para agrupar la mayor cantidad posible de escuelas con el objeto de mantener el promedio por arriba del límite del programa y, gracias a ello, 18 de nuestras escuelas califican para este programa, entre ellas la nuestra.

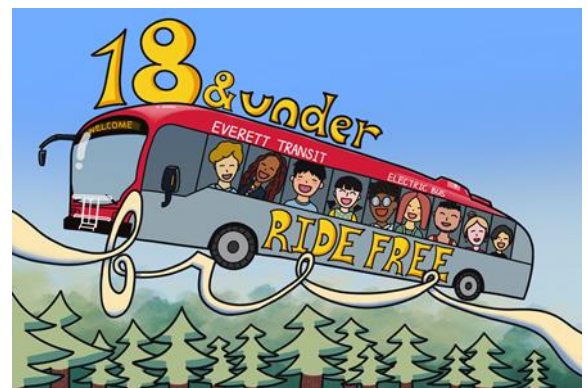
Esto significa que los desayunos y almuerzos son gratuitos para todos los alumnos en dichas escuelas, independientemente de si califican para almuerzo gratuito o a precio reducido. Las familias en esas escuelas deben completar un informe de ingresos del hogar, que le enviamos directamente por correo electrónico, en lugar de la solicitud de almuerzo gratuito o a precio reducido. Dicho informe es importante para brindar acceso a los alumnos a exenciones gratuitas y otros servicios.

Nos complace enormemente poder utilizar este nuevo programa para ofrecer comidas gratuitas a los alumnos en nuestro distrito que pueden necesitar cierto apoyo adicional y a todos nuestros alumnos, independientemente del lugar en el que estudian, les seguiremos ofreciendo comidas nutritivas y deliciosas que incluyen frutas y vegetales frescos de temporada, alimentos de granos enteros preparados desde cero y proteínas magras, además de opciones vegetarianas y libres de gluten.

Es el momento ideal para consumir comidas escolares. Quedamos a la espera de la oportunidad de servirlo muy pronto.

Community Transit gratis para jóvenes menores de 18 años

A partir del 1 de septiembre, los jóvenes menores de 18 años pueden viajar en todos los servicios de Community Transit de forma gratuita. Eso incluye autobuses, servicio de paratransito de DART y vanpools (si pertenecen a un vanpool). Se recomienda encarecidamente a los adolescentes de 13 a 18 años que obtengan una tarjeta ORCA para jóvenes para usarla para el “pago” de la tarifa. Community Transit los proporcionará en nuestras escuelas secundarias antes de que comiencen las clases y en las escuelas intermedias cuando reciban más envíos. Procedimientos de asistencia

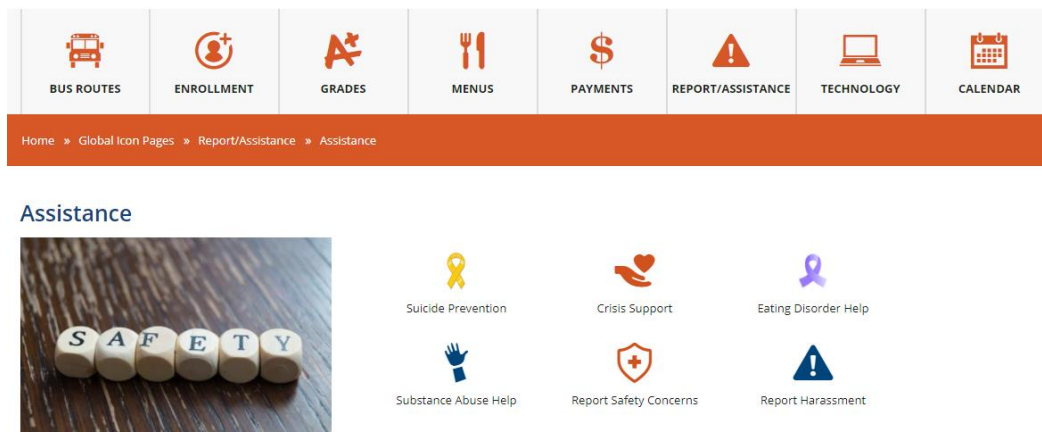

Programa Kids in Transition

El programa Kids in Transition (KIT) brinda apoyo a los alumnos que califican para dos programas federales que brindan apoyo a niños y jóvenes con viviendas de alta movilidad: aquellos que cumplen con la definición más inclusiva de sin hogar conforme a la [Ley de Asistencia a Personas sin Hogar McKinney-Vento](#) federal y los que califican para [apoyo para Educación de Hogar Sustituto](#).



Los alumnos en hogares sustitutos (en los que una agencia de bienestar infantil cuenta con autoridad y está a cargo de los cuidados) o aquellos que no tienen una residencia nocturna fija, regular y adecuada pueden calificar para este apoyo adicional.

El objetivo del programa KIT es eliminar los obstáculos para el éxito académico y la participación en actividades extracurriculares de los alumnos. Nos aseguramos de que los alumnos que califican tienen acceso a comidas, materiales y uniformes escolares gratuitos. El programa KIT puede ayudar a los alumnos a acceder a clases de jornada extendida o de escuela de verano o coordinar el acceso a apoyo académico o clases de apoyo adicionales cuando sea necesario. El programa KIT también puede cubrir o coordinar exenciones de los cargos exigidos para participar en actividades tales como deportes patrocinados por la escuela, clubes y cargos por clases obligatorias. El programa KIT también puede contribuir a organizar el transporte para los alumnos que califican para mantener la estabilidad escolar, siempre y cuando el transporte sea viable y resulte la mejor opción para el alumno. También trabajamos en sociedad con el Centro de Recursos Familiares y otras agencias comunitarias para vincular a las familias y alumnos con los recursos que necesitan.

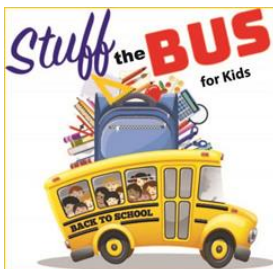
