Rev. Dr. Martin King, Jr. said, "I say to you today, my friends, that in spite of the difficulties and frustrations of the moment, I still have a dream."

Please write an essay on the following question:

Dr. King gave his "I Have a Dream" speech over 50 years ago and still there are difficulties and frustrations. With all the difficulties and frustrations of the moment, how would you make Dr. King's dream of America into a reality?

### **Background and instructions:**

Consider how Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s legacy affected the civil rights and other important issues of all Americans. In 1963 during the March on Washington, Dr. King spoke of his dreams that "one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: 'We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal." His message was to reach all people to overcome the fear and hate that creates inequity and injustice – what is your message of making his dream a reality?
