What is post-secondary?







Post-secondary refers to **any** college, training program and/or career plans after high school graduation.

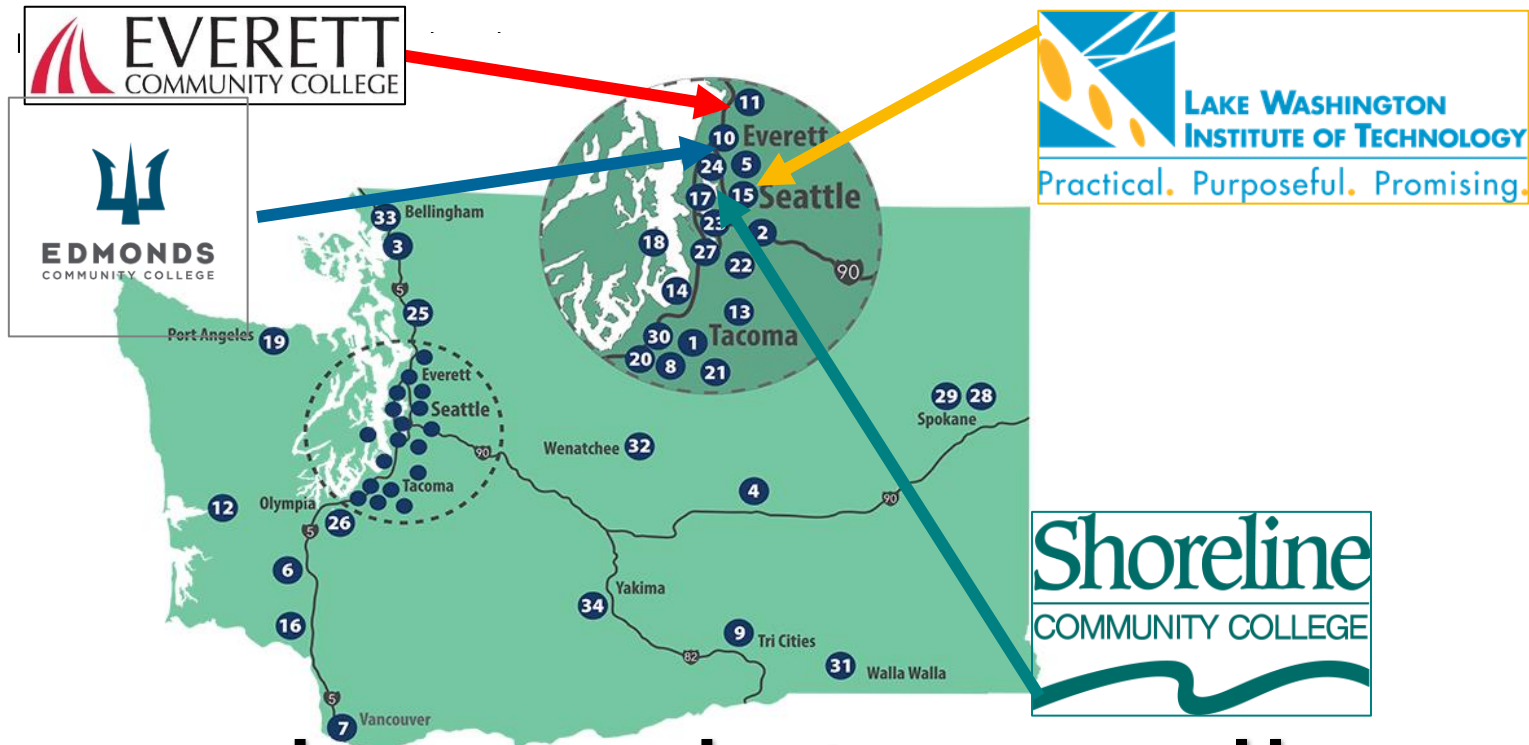

WCG for Apprenticeship



Earn Money While You Learn.

In an apprenticeship, you can get paid to work and use financial aid to cover out-of-pocket costs. The new **Washington College Grant for Apprenticeship (WCG-A)** provides funding for qualified apprentices in a variety of programs in Washington.

WCG-A is available to people of all ages. Even apprentices from middle-class families can qualify.

WCG-Apprenticeship provides:

- Money for tuition and fees, books and supplies, necessary equipment and tools.
- Guaranteed funding to eligible apprentices.

Ask your apprenticeship program sponsor if they are approved to participate in WCG for Apprenticeship. Visit the program website below for a list of current sponsors.

Participating apprentices must:

1. Be a resident of Washington State.
2. Be working in a registered apprenticeship that participates in the WCG-A program.
3. Apply directly to the apprenticeship program sponsor that you will be working for.

The Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) associate degree is designed to transfer to most Bachelor of Arts degrees at all four-year colleges and universities in Washington state. The DTA is sometimes called an Associate in Arts or an Associate in Arts and Sciences.

DTA degrees provide students:

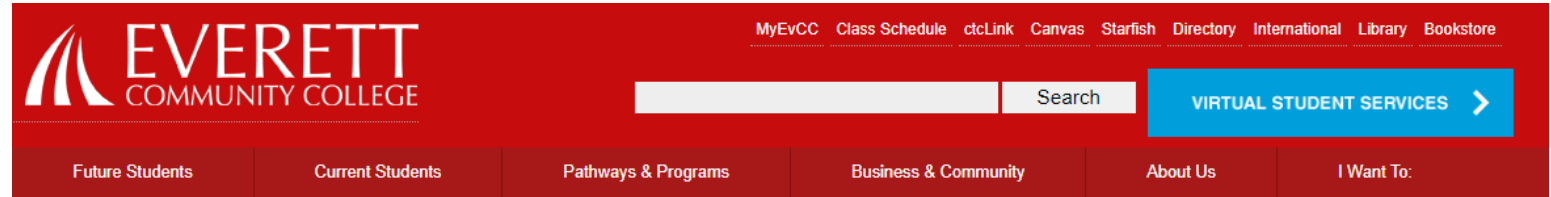
- Priority consideration in the admissions for most humanities and social science majors public universities ahead of students without a degree.
- Completion of lower division general education requirements.
- Credit for all courses completed within the DTA up to and in some cases beyond 90 credits.
- Opportunity to explore several fields of study through the category of up to 30 credits of elective courses.
- Opportunity to complete prerequisites for a future major.

DTA Associate Degree Guidelines

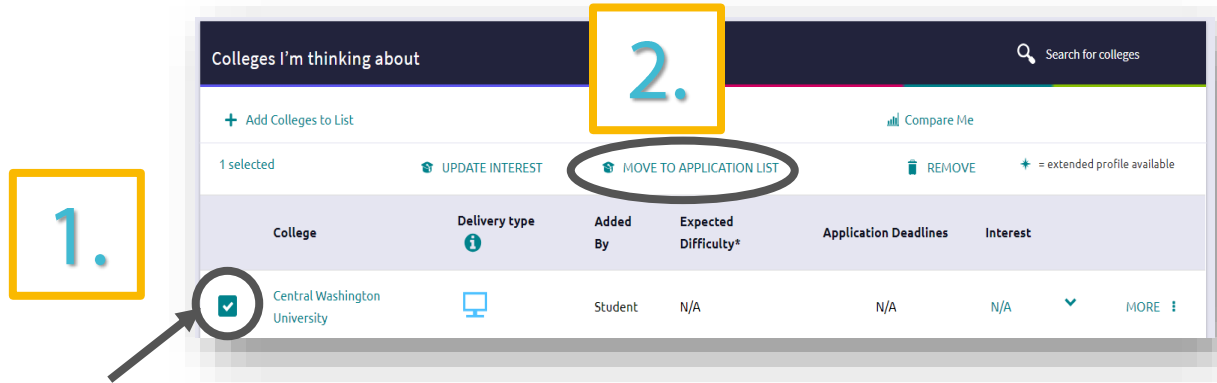

- Additional financial information such as child support statements, TANF or welfare information, real estate, investments, family business or farm info.

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
