- 1 to 2 year programs
- Provide training for skilled, high tech workers

Four-Year Colleges & Universities

- Typically 4-year programs offering variety of Bachelor's degrees
- A university (as opposed to a college) also offers master's degrees (M.A., M.S.) and doctorates (Ph.D.) for advanced, highly specialized study.







Military Service

- **Educational opportunities**
 - Up to 90% tuition assistance for college courses
 - Technical training in over 200 skill areas
 - G.I. Bill-Tuition for any school



Internships

- An intern is a student undergoing supervised practical training.
- Real-life applications of the skills students learn in school.
- An internship is a way to "try on a job" before deciding on a career.

Apprenticeships

- Training program where you earn wages while learning a skilled profession in a specific field.
- Supervised by a trade professional
- Includes classroom studies and on-the-job training
- Earn a salary while you learn about your trade





Earn Money While You Learn.

In an apprenticeship, you can get paid to work and use financial aid to cover out-of-pocket costs. The new **Washington College Grant for Apprenticeship** (WCG-A) provides funding for qualified apprentices in a variety of programs in Washington.

WCG-A is available to people of all ages. Even apprentices from middle-class families can qualify.

WCG-Apprenticeship provides:

· Money for tuition and fees, books and supplies, necessary equipment and tools.

· Guaranteed funding to eligible apprentices.

The Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) associate degree is designed to transfer to most Bachelor of Arts degrees at all four-year colleges and universities in Washington state. The DTA is sometimes called an Associate in Arts or an Associate in Arts and Sciences.

DTA degrees provide students:

- Priority consideration in the admissions for most humanities and social science majors public universities ahead of students without a degree.
- · Completion of lower division general education requirements.
- Credit for all courses completed within the DTA up to and in some cases beyond 90 credits.
- . Opportunity to explore several fields of study through the category of up to 30 credits of elective courses.
- Opportunity to complete prerequisites for a future major.

DTA Associate Degree Guidelines

The Intercollege Relations Commission (ICRC) — a unit of The Washington Council — oversees the guidelines for DTAs. The ICRC maintains the most current edition of the ICRC Handbook [PDF] which provides the DTA degree's requirements, provisos and other requirements.






