

KIT & Summer School FAQs



Q1: Is the district offering in person summer school classes?

A1: Everett Public Schools is offering <u>high school summer academy</u> and <u>middle school summer</u> <u>academy</u>. There will also be Kindergarten preparation with <u>Everett Ready</u> and some Summer Extended School Year (ESY) classes that may be implemented through a student's IEP. Students may choose to access <u>i-Ready for online support</u> to help fill gaps in learning.

Q2: How do students register for summer school?

A2: Click the links below for instructions for each program:

Q3: Does Summer School cost anything? If so, will KIT help?

A3: Most summer programming is at no cost. Online classes are hosted through OnlineHS are <u>tuition-based</u>. The KIT office may be able to assist KIT students who need a class to catch up (not "get ahead").

Q4: What are the dates and locations for summer school?

A4: Middle and High School In-person classes are at Eisenhower Middle School and are scheduled for July 8 – July 26, 2024; online classes are scheduled for June 24 – August 1, 2024 Click the link for site information for Everett Ready.

Q5: Is there transportation available for KIT students who are out of the regular service area, to get to summer school?

A5: Yes, KIT Students who live out of the regular service area are eligible for transportation if it is feasible, even if they are in another district. High school students might also be able to use an Orca pass if they are on a good route and are capable of utilizing public transportation.

Q6: Do I need to notify the KIT office if I have a KIT student who needs transportation for summer school?

A6: The KIT office will run reports for identifying the transportation needs for summer school. If you know of a specific need, or a student who will need an Orca pass, please send an email to us with the information. Official requests will be sent from the KIT office to the transportation department two weeks prior to the start date in order to plan for the routing.

Q7: What if the student found stable housing in a different school district and is scheduled to be removed from KIT at the end of the year; can they do summer school here in Everett?

A7: Yes, students are eligible for our KIT support to finish the entire school year (including summer school).
