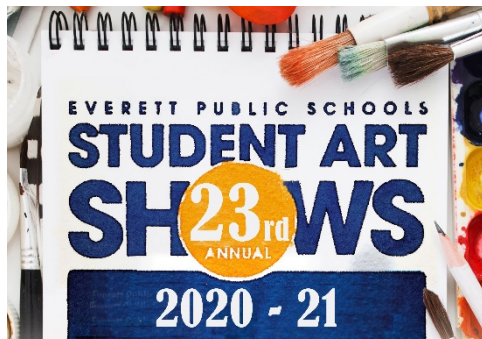
2021 ATHLETES OF THE YEAR

Emergency Broadband Benefit

The Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month toward broadband service for eligible families and households who are struggling to stay connected during the COVID pandemic. Qualifying households on Tribal lands can receive a discount of up to \$75 per month for service. Eligible households can also receive a discount of up to \$100 for the purchase of a laptop, desktop computer, or

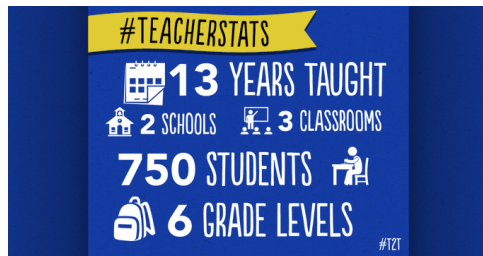
