- Summary of Request For Proposal (RFP) process
  - o Vendors submitted proposals for their product.
  - o Two vendors selected and product demo presentations held Dec. 4-7.
  - 330 stakeholders participated, including teachers, admins, counselors, office professionals, paraeducators, parents, and students.
  - Stakeholder input tallied.
  - School Board and superintendent updated on status on regular basis.
- Current Status
  - o Vendor choice has been made; preliminary contract provided to district.
- Next steps
  - Recommendation of chosen vendor/product will be presented to the school board on Feb. 13 requesting board approval and superintendent signature.
  - Contract signed.
  - o Begin conversion process to new system February 2024.
    - Project timeline will be provided when contract is finalized.
    - Training for all stakeholders prior to rollout September 2025
