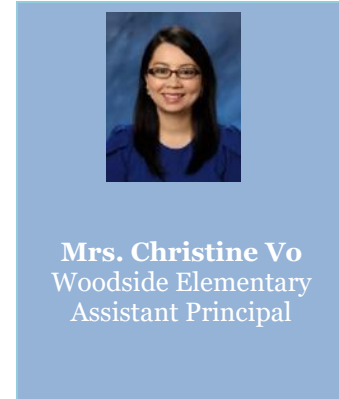

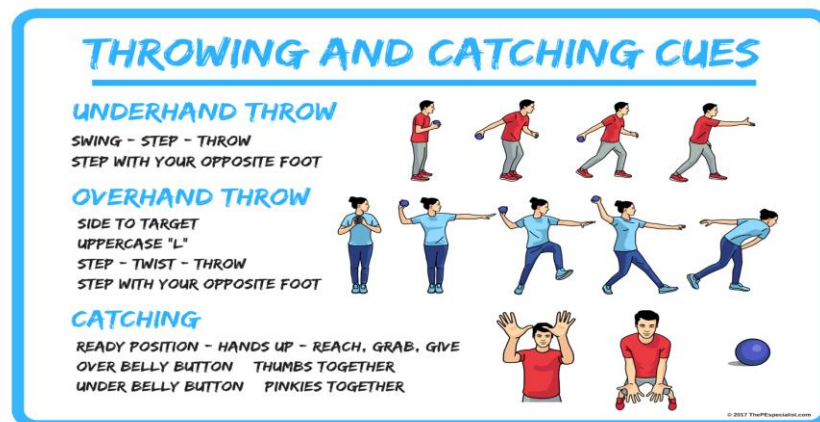


Woodside Newsletter Information for Physical Education

Physical Education Update-

K-2 grades just finished their Locomotor skills unit last week. Locomotor skills enable children to move through different environments, moving their body from one place to another. The key locomotor skills are walking, running, jumping, hopping, galloping, sliding, leaping, jogging, and skipping. We are starting our Throwing and Catching unit this week. A few games we will be playing are Yard of the Month, Egg Toss Challenge, Throw and Catch Tag, and Farming Frenzy.

3-5 grades completed the first round of Fitness Testing (Burpees, Sit-ups, Sit and Reach, and Pacer). Students worked hard on each fitness component; I am extremely pleased with the results! We are also in our first week of Throwing and Catching unit. A few competitions we are going to play during the unit are Boom City, Win the Pin, and Battle for the Boat.

What is happening in music this December?

Mrs. Hill is back at Woodside! After staying home and enjoying time with my 9-month-old baby, Nina, and my almost 4-year-old, Nora, I am so happy to be back at Woodside making music with our students!



The students at Woodside have been doing wonderful things in music class since I came back. Each week in music, we focus on different concepts and skills so we can become well rounded and informed musicians. All students at Woodside have recently spent time each music class on the drums. Drumming together as a class teaches all the students how to listen, perform, and create music as an ensemble.

CONGRATULATIONS 5th Grade on a great Veterans Day Assembly! The 5th graders worked very hard, and the Veterans Day Assembly was a huge success!

4th Grade will start learning about a new rhythm, sixteenth notes. Ask your child what a sixteenth note is, how it sounds, and if they can show you how to write it!

3rd Grade is learning a new rhythm this month: half note (to-o). Ask your child what a half note is, how many beats it is (2), and if they can show you how to write the new rhythm. We will be practicing our new rhythm in various instrument and reading activities using music from *The Nutcracker*.

2nd Grade will begin preparing for their upcoming **Martin Luther King Jr. Assembly**. The MLK Assembly will take place on **Friday, January 13th at 9:00AM in the Gym**. Families are invited to attend the morning performance.

1st Grade will be learning their 1st rhythm this month: quarter note (ta) and eighth notes (ti-ti). Ask your child what a ta and ti-ti are, how they sound, and if they can show you how to write them!

Kindergarten has been working on keeping a steady beat. We have been working on maintaining the beat in many ways including playing drums, moving to the music, and creating movements that show the beat.

Guaranteed Admissions Program

We are excited to announce Everett Public Schools is now a participating institution in the [Guaranteed Admission Program](#), or GAP.

Everett Public Schools has partnered with Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, The Evergreen State College, Washington State University and Western Washington University to help students meet their college and career goals through the Guaranteed Admissions Program (GAP). Through GAP, a student who meets the following criteria is guaranteed admission to these institutions.



To qualify for the Guaranteed Admissions Program, a student must have:

1. A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
2. Completed necessary College Academic Distribution Requirements (CADR) courses in high school (typically mirrors high school grad requirements)
3. Completed this Guaranteed Admissions Program Opt-in Form giving your permission to release information to the participating colleges and universities

The Guaranteed Admissions Program Opt-in Form is for parents/guardians of current juniors and seniors of Everett Public Schools high schools. The deadline for completing this form is Friday, January 6, 2023. [Opt-In Form](#)

The gift of attendance

Absences spike in the weeks before and after the winter holiday as families squeeze in a few more vacation days. Just a few missed days here and there, even excused absences, can add up and lost learning time can put your child behind in school.

This is as true in kindergarten as it is in high school. Put simply, too many absences at any age can affect a student's chances for academic success and eventually for graduation. This holiday season give your children the gift of an education and the habit of attendance.



Every day of school is an important opportunity for students to learn as well as to connect with their peers and teachers. As long as your child is healthy, please encourage showing up to class when school is in session.

If your child is absent, please email the school at their attendance email address, which you can find on the school website. If email is not possible, and even if you leave a message with the school attendance line, please send a written note to the school office within 30 days after your student returns to school.

Space still available in ECEAP preschool

Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families (DCYF).

The six ECEAP sites within our school district are Cedar Wood, Hawthorne, Jackson, Lowell, Madison, and Silver Lake elementary schools. Space is limited – apply now! For an application or more information, please visit the www.everettsd.org/ECEAP or call 425-385-4628.



Transitional Kindergarten Program

Everett Public Schools offers Transitional Kindergarten (TK) for children who are not currently in an early learning program and are scheduled to enter kindergarten in the fall of 2023. The program focuses on basic academic, social and self-help skills to jumpstart qualifying students toward success in school. Students will be screened and may qualify based on need.

To be eligible for screening, children must:

- be five years old by August 31, 2023
- live within the boundaries of Everett Public Schools
- not be currently enrolled in an early learning program
- demonstrate academic and/or social-emotional needs



Requests for screening opened in November. If you are interested in Transitional Kindergarten and believe your child may qualify, please visit our website at www.everettsd.org/TransitionalKindergarten and submit an interest form by **Friday, December 16, 2022**.

Transitional Kindergarten begins in late January 2023 and will run through the last day of school in June 2023. School locations will be determined in January and will be communicated directly to eligible families. Accepting Highly Capable referrals until Dec. 16

The Highly Capable program in Everett Public Schools is designed to meet learning needs and challenge students who have advanced thinking and academic abilities. “HC” classes, as they are often referred to, are open to students in second, third, fourth and fifth grade. HC students learn and study in self-contained classrooms with a fast-paced curriculum that encourages and inspires them to develop higher level thinking skills. HC classrooms are held in specific schools in the district, based upon qualified enrollment. The district provides transportation to students in HC classes.

Delayed start or closed schools

If we must cancel school or delay the start of school, we will use our parent communication system to call in the morning, typically around 5:30 a.m. (or sometimes the night before if it can already be determined) with a brief message about the reason for closure or delay. We will also use local media, social media and post the message on our website.

If there is no announcement about Everett Public Schools, school is on the regular schedule. More information and resources for school closures or delays is on the district website under the *Parents* tab.

Las ausencias aumentan en las semanas anteriores y posteriores a las vacaciones de invierno, ya que las familias aprovechan algunos días más de vacaciones. En pocas palabras, demasiadas ausencias a cualquier edad pueden afectar las posibilidades de éxito académico de un estudiante y, al final, su graduación. Programa de jardín de infancia de transición

Las escuelas públicas de Everett ofrecen el jardín de infancia de transición (Transitional Kindergarten, TK) para los niños que no están en este momento en un programa de aprendizaje temprano y están programados para entrar en el jardín de infancia en el otoño de 2023. El programa se centra en las habilidades académicas, sociales y de autoayuda básicas para impulsar a los estudiantes que califican hacia el éxito en la escuela. Los estudiantes serán sometidos a una prueba y podrán calificar según sus necesidades.

Para ser elegibles para la prueba, los niños deben:

- Cumplir cinco años antes del 31 de agosto de 2023.
- Vivir dentro de los límites de las escuelas públicas de Everett.
- No estar inscritos en un programa de aprendizaje temprano en este momento.
- Demostrar necesidades académicas o sociales y emocionales.



Las solicitudes de prueba se abrieron en noviembre. Si usted está interesado en el jardín de infancia de transición y cree que su hijo puede calificar, visite nuestro sitio web en www.everettsd.org/TransitionalKindergarten y envíe un formulario de interés antes del **viernes, 16 de diciembre de 2022**.

El jardín de infancia de transición comienza a finales de enero de 2023 y se extenderá hasta el último día de clase en junio de 2023. La ubicación de las escuelas se determinará en enero y se les comunicará directamente a las familias elegibles.

Se aceptan remisiones de Highly Capable hasta el 16 de diciembre

El programa Highly Capable de las escuelas públicas de Everett está diseñado para satisfacer las necesidades de aprendizaje y desafiar a los estudiantes que tienen habilidades académicas y de pensamiento avanzadas. Las clases de "HC", como se les suele llamar, están abiertas a estudiantes de segundo, tercero, cuarto y quinto grado.

Los estudiantes de HC aprenden y estudian en aulas autónomas con un plan de estudios de ritmo rápido que los anima e inspira a desarrollar habilidades de pensamiento de nivel superior. Las aulas de HC se encuentran en escuelas específicas del distrito, en función de las inscripciones calificadas. El distrito les proporciona transporte a los estudiantes en las clases de HC.
