Guidelines for Staff on Immigration-Related Concerns

I am writing to share information about policies and procedures related to immigration status that could impact our staff, students, and families. At Everett Public Schools, we are a place where every child is valued, every family is supported, and every student has the right to an excellent education.

The Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) has released updated guidelines which reminds Washington state school districts about their legal obligations and practices around student education.

While we highly recommend <u>reviewing the entire document</u>, the key parts for staff include the following: **SCHOOL STAFF WILL:**

- Enroll and provide services to all students, regardless of immigration or citizenship status.
- Collect only data and records required for enrollment purposes.
- Be aware that schools have no legal authority to enforce U.S. immigration laws.
- Follow policies and procedures that align with state laws for responding to immigration enforcement actions impacting your school campus.
 - o Board Policy 4300: Limiting Immigration Enforcement in Schools
 - o Procedure 4411P: Working Relationships with Law Enforcement

SCHOOL STAFF WILL NOT:

- Deny admission or continuing enrollment to a student based on the student's citizenship status.
- Require or create an impression that birth certificates or social security numbers are required for enrollment or continuing enrollment.
- Engage in any practices to "chill" the right of access to school.
- Require students or parent(s)/guardian(s) to disclose or document their immigration status.
- Make inquiries of students or parent(s)/guardian(s) that may expose their undocumented status.
- Allow immigration enforcement access to information, records, students, or school campuses without a valid court order, judicial warrant, or other legal requirement.

We have shared this information with our families. If you have questions or need additional resources, please reach out to your building principal or direct supervisor.

Everett Public Schools is preparing to transition to our new student information system, Synergy, which will play a vital role in the daily operations of our schools. This system is designed to enhance how we manage student data, streamline processes, and improve efficiency across the district.

To support staff through this important transition, the LITS team is finalizing training plans for Synergy users. Training sessions will take place in late May and early June, with options designed to accommodate busy schedules, including flexible times, locations, and formats. Teacher-specific training is scheduled during one of the Teacher LID days in August, with teacher trainers receiving preparation in April to ensure they are ready to support their colleagues. - Families | March 17–April 4


Canva for Education District Access

Technology can be a useful tool for being productive and efficient, but one of its superpowers is to allow us to create and innovate. Canva is a powerful graphic design tool that has made it easy for anyone to create professional-looking presentations, graphics, flyers, images, logos, and more. Visuals are an important way to engage students, staff, and community members in your message.

To support student and staff creativity and productivity, we are going to be making the full Canva for Education tool accessible for all staff and students over the next few weeks. **This version is the same as the Pro version but it's free for education.** You will not need to renew any Pro licenses in the future if you switch to using the Canva for Education version.

When we make the switch, current Canva users will be able to move between their current account and their new district account by clicking on their profile and switching between them on the drop-down.

Admin, teachers, and students will be put in teams by school. Any paras or staff not assigned to schools will be in a Staff & Admin team. Being in a team allows you to share designs with others or to collaborate. We'll also be setting up the integration with Canvas so you can assign Canva projects directly from your Canvas course.



You will still have access to Adobe Spark and other Adobe Creativity tools but adding Canva will provide some choice. Canva is also being integrated into tools like Parent Square, Book Creator, and more so look for it to show up in more places.
