Mission

Parent and School Partnership

Parents are an integral part of the Dual Language program. The success of the students depends largely on the commitment and support of the parents involved. Initially, you will need to consider the following:

- At least a six-year commitment (K-5)
- Regular school attendance by your child
- Strong commitment to your child by being supportive and involved in your child's education

What is a Dual Language Program?

Dual Language is an educational model that integrates native English speakers and native Spanish speakers for the instructional day. The goal is to promote high academic achievement, first and second language development, and cross cultural understanding for all students. Academic subjects are taught to all students in English and Spanish. The program creates a biliterate environment for all students, since the first language is maintained while the second language is acquired (Thomas & Collier, 2004).

Kindergarten and first grade students will learn for 90% of the day in Spanish, and 10% of the day in English. As students progress through the grades, their instruction time in Spanish will decrease by 10% per year, and instruction time in English will increase by 10% per year until students reach fifth grade where they will learn 50% of the time in English and the other 50% of the time in Spanish.

The Benefits of Being Bilingual

- Has research-based cognitive and academic advantages
- Improves understanding of one's native language
- Enriches and enhances intellectual development
- Opens doors to other cultures and fosters an understanding and appreciation for multicultural diversity
- Encourages analytic and creative thinking
- Develops higher order thinking skills
- Increases career opportunities (Thomas & Collier, 2004)

Dual Language Goals

Bilingual-The learner will become fluent in both English and Spanish by building greater verbal skills with an increased ability to communicate across the languages.

Bicultural-The learner will broaden understanding and appreciation in both cultures by acquiring multicultural competencies and perspectives.

Job Market Advantages-The learner will improve future employment skills for an increasingly diverse and challenging job market.
