Overview

The Capital Bond Planning Committee was established in response to a resolution from the EPS Board to develop a recommendation for the Superintendent by June 24, 2025, describing the scope, size and timing of a capital bond proposal to be placed before district voters. The Board anticipates the bond proposal will be placed on an election ballot in 2026.

The committee is made up of 39 members including community members, students, principals, and assistant principals.

The committee will be facilitated by Mr. Jim Dugan from Parametrix, Inc.

The Committee is expected to work over the next three months. The Committee meetings are held twice monthly on Thursday evenings between 5:30 PM and 7:00 PM (unless otherwise noted) Capital Bond Planning Committee Meetings (CBPCM) that are complete are noted in yellow below. Capital Bond Planning Committee – Guiding Principles

Capital Bond Planning Committee Guiding Principles Everett Public Schools

The Committee's guiding principals were part of the Board's Resolution No. 1317 which established the Committee. The Committee is to carefully consider the following in arriving at its recommendation:

- 1) Community Input: Consider in some manner the key themes raised by the community over the last several months as well as community input and feedback on the proposed Committee recommendation, and
- 2) **Enrollment**: Consider the need for new classrooms and property to house current and future students, particularly at the elementary level; and
- 3) Aging Facilities: Consider the need to modernize schools based on age as well as condition, and the need to replace or upgrade building systems such as HVAC, roofing, flooring, plumbing and electrical; and
- 4) Educational Programs: Consider the need to upgrade existing buildings to accommodate new or enhanced educational programs; and
- 5) Safety and Security: Consider the need to improve safety and security in district facilities to better protect staff and students; and
- 6) **Technology**: Consider the need to provide new, enhanced, and replacement technology infrastructure and equipment for instruction and support operations; and 7) **Property Taxes**: Consider the variables affecting future tax rates, the difficulties in predicting future tax rates, and the sensitivity of the community towards increasing tax rates.

Jim Dugan

Welcome

Mr. Dugan with Parametrix welcomed the committee members and thanked them for their time this evening. He asked committee members to sit with their teams from last meeting to continue the work.

April 4 School Tours

Mr. Walker provided an overview of the schools that were visited on the April 4th tours and asked the committee who had attended the tours to share their thoughts and questions from the tours with the entire committee. The tour was reviewed in the order in which it was taken.

Cedarwood ES

- Safety of the portables is a concern due to being outside the building and their proximity to the road
- Teaching and SPED are using the hallways due to lack of space in classrooms
- Security concern for portables students needing to use restrooms
 - Mr. Walker did note that portables students have access to main building with a key card "hall pass" if their classroom is in the portable and they need access to main building
- Not enough restrooms at school for population, particular problem if any of them are closed for repairs
 - Concerns that limited number of restrooms leads to mixing of grade levels during use, this is a concern
- Students were very vocal about portables
 - Very crowded
 - Difficult learning environment
 - Depressing
- In spite of its age, Cedarwood is well-maintained
- Question was asked "How old are some of those portables?" Answer: Some are over 40 years old and portables are not designed for that longevity.
- Staff was very impressive, making due with what they have.

Tambark Creek ES

- We should make all of our schools like this one
- Big windows
- Lots of light
- Air-conditioning
- SPED space had adequate break-out areas
- Gym had operable walls that open to cafeteria and stage
- Ample space

- Better ADA access than other schools
- Overall accessible to all students
- Inclusive
- Why does it already have portables?

Lowell ES

- Lots of land to build a new school on the site
- Very depressing
- Poor air quality
- Lack of parking
- Ceilings are low
- Huge disparity/inequity between Tambark and Lowell
- Inadequate ADA access
- Not enough play area
- · SPED is isolated
- No interactive SPED playground equipment
- One long hallway down center of school make it very busy, no private break-out spaces, very chaotic
- Food service in hallway adds to the chaos, need more room
- Library needs more books
- Great staff and very positive principal

Cascade HS

- Auto shop program was the highlight, great opportunities for kids, involved in the community, hands-on learning
- Auto shop facility needs upgrades and should be bigger, grow the program, it's special
- Pickleball courts need renovation (maybe we could rent out of we renovate?)
- Handball courts are a horror show
- Wrestling room needs renovation
- Need windows and daylight in the gym
- Building Two is a big focal point on campus, lots of issues
 - o Kitchen is undersized
 - Bad roof
 - Lots of dark corners, difficult to supervise
 - This is the hub of the campus, it needs to be adequately sized and in good condition, it supports the entire campus

Everett HS

- Commercial Building has HVAC issues, way too hot on a day that was not warm outside
- Transitions program in the basement is an awful space
- Need better SPED facilities for teaching and learning
- Need more changing spaces and restroom facilities for SPED
- Magnet program for medical pathways on floors 2 and 3 are in good shape

- Need to update the 1st floor of the commercial building (Mr. Walker indicated 1st floor has not been updated since 1980)
- Impressed by the CTE program

Overall Comments

- Too many portables across the District
- How do we get students out of portables?
 - Mr. Walker indicated the District would need two new elementaries to get students out of portables

Financial Overview

Ms. Andi Tress, Executive Director of Finance and Business Services presented information on the current tax rate for EPS and the potential annual effects of a \$.10/\$1000 Assessed value increase to the tax rate.

Committee Work Session

Mr. Dugan explained the evening activity and expected outcome. Each table contained a summary of the work from the last session. The work in the last session was to prioritize the projects.

Mr. Dugan took the last session work and aggregated the information to determine the projects that the majority had deemed most important in the last session. Those sixteen items were represented on voting sheets on the front wall. The seven items with the fewest priorities were represented on the back wall.

The committee's work was to rate the first sixteen items, using a scale of one to sixteen, one being the most important. The committee members were to place all sixteen of their numbered dots on the front wall.

The activity was repeated for the seven items on the back wall.

Mr. Dugan will aggregate this information and the committee will review the list at their next meeting, taking into account any feedback from the upcoming community meetings that may change the committee's view on priorities.

Board Presentation Volunteers
