EHS - State Universities Course Equivalencies:

Each year, I get many questions about how College in the High School, UW in the High School, Tech Prep and Advanced Placement courses are considered for credit at different universities. Out of state universities each have their own process for accepting transfer credit. You should consult with them about course equivalencies as early as possible. I have attached charts which show how transfer courses are accepted at Western Washington University, Central Washington University, University of Washington and Washington State University.

Keep in mind that these challenging options are always a good option despite whether or not they transfer for credit because colleges look at the level of courses applicants took in high school as well as the grade. Generally, a slightly lower grade in a challenging course is better than an A in a low level course.
