## Athletic Director Robert Polk earns state and national awards

Polk earns NIAAA Award of Merit and named WSSAAA Athletic Director of the Year

On April 25, 2015, Robert Polk, Certified Master Athletic Administrator (CMAA) and district athletic director, was awarded National Interscholastic Athletic Administrator Association's (NIAAA) 2015 Award of Merit. The award recognizes Polk for "meritorious dedication to middle and high school athletics."

Polk also earned Washington Secondary School Athletic Administrators Association's (<u>WSSAAA</u>) 2015 Athletic Director of the Year.

Polk's selection for the awards is long overdue, in the minds of those who have worked with him in the district and across the state. "Robert

is a first class professional who possesses the qualities and characteristics of an outstanding athletic director and is an ideal candidate for Washington State Athletic Director of the Year," wrote Dr. Joyce Stewart, associate superintendent of teaching and learning, in her letter of recommendation to WSSAAA.

Polk has been an athletic director since 2000 – first at Olympic High School in the Central Kitsap School District for four years and then at Everett Public Schools. This is his 11th year in Everett. Polk is an NIAAA Leadership Training State Coordinator, NIAAA National Instructor, and has been a presenter for numerous WSSAAA state conferences.

He coordinates the district health education curriculum, physical education curriculum and training for teachers and coaches. He has managed a \$750,000 Physical Education grant and has served on the district Fiscal Advisory Council, Wellness Committee, Safety Committee and Capital Facilities Advisory Council. He also manages the Northwest District One Tournaments for baseball, basketball, wrestling, and track and field.

Unrelated to his athletic responsibilities, Polk also coordinates the student school board member representatives. In that role, he oversees recruiting student candidates for those board-selected positions, prepping the students for interviews and briefing them on the legal practices, processes and obligations of the district's elected governing body. Superintendent Cohn explained, "I selected Robert for that role working with student leaders because of Robert's own leadership capabilities, his relationship with students of all ages and his unquestionable ethics in a position that helps shapes future leaders."

Associate Superintendent Tony Byrd adds, "Robert steadfastly dedicates his time to serving students and staff. He is a humble, quiet leader for equity of program offerings, gender equality in athletics, and much more. He trains staff, he listens to the community, and he artfully balances the demands of his work with his highest priority – being a wonderful father and husband."

Polk earned his bachelor's degree from University of Puget Sound and his master's from Central Missouri State University.
