A French poet and novelist, Anatole France, who lived from 1844 to 1924, wrote words that he could not have known then would so perfectly describe our culture in Everett Public Schools today, "To accomplish great things, we must not only act, but also dream; not only plan, but also believe."

As we ready our schools and ourselves to welcome our students, we each prepare in our own way. Whether your job includes greeting students and helping them find their way around school, teaching them in a classroom, or supporting schools by keeping them "up and running" so students have a safe, comfortable place to learn, you have a very important role as school begins. You contribute to the success of a child

For me, the excitement of the first day is palpable. And all of that planning and preparation pays off as we open school doors once again, as we welcome kids back into school, and even as we send them off after their first day back. Together, we help children and their families feel welcome in our schools, and excited about returning ready to go the next day.

No, I haven't forgotten that last bit of France's advice: "believe" he encouraged. Because of what you've invested in this start, I believe school is beginning smoothly. Because of what you've invested in this year, I believe this will be your finest year yet. I believe you will be at your best today and every day after, and that each child who touches your life will be better for it. I believe that because of you, kids will know opportunities that otherwise would not be theirs. That indeed is a great accomplishment, and one of which we can all be proud. Children can dream of doing great things, believe in themselves, and then go out and act with confidence in the world. What great jobs we have!
