2016 FIELD TRIPS

Chuck Close Prints: Process and Collaboration Field Trips: May 16–June 3

The exhibit will provide a comprehensive survey of the artist's 40+ year involvement with printmaking and his prodigious accomplishment in the field. As many as 170 works of art are included, designed especially to highlight several series of state proofs, to provide viewers with a view of the technical and creative process required to realize these complex images.

Field Trips last 75 minutes and include a docent led tour, artists in action, and a hands-on activity.

Cost is \$50.00 per class, up to 30 students. Appointment times are 9:15-10:30, 10:45-12:00, and 12:15-1:30.

WORKSHOPS AND CLASSES

Workshop – Exploring Multiple Art Techniques in Portraiture: Showcasing Chuck Close is scheduled for November 6 & 7. Designed for the generalist teacher, this ten-hour workshop focuses on teaching specific learning outcomes in the genre of the portrait, using a variety of arts based activities as a vehicle for learning. In line with our spring Chuck Close exhibit, a look at his extensive work with portraiture will be examined. Specific objectives will focus on integrating portraiture into the classroom to provide exciting opportunities to connect students with history, language arts and math. Standards-based activities will demonstrate how portraits and self-portraits can enhance student engagement across the disciplines. Projects, for Kindergarten through 8th Grade, will be presented by experienced artists and learning specialists. Assessment strategies will be discussed and all activities are designed to be class-time efficient. Available for SPU credit/clock hours & Everett SD clock hours. See below.

Goal & Course Objectives:

Course Objectives: Our goal is to instruct teachers in the state’s learning requirements in the arts and develop their skill to teach the arts across subject areas. Our objectives for achieving this goal are to:

- ◆ Provide a standards base and information on how to effectively embed visual art concepts pertaining to Common Core State Standards (CCSS) in English-Language Arts (ELA) and Math, and Next Generation Science Standards, based on Washington State’s Essential Academic Learning Requirements (EALRS) and National Core Arts Standards (NCAS).
- ◆ Provide lesson plans with specific materials, resources, background information, assessments and instructions /directions for aligning visual art learning outcomes with language arts, math and science.
- ◆ Provide instruction and ideas for engaging students and guiding them to:
Create – conceive and develop new artistic ideas and work; Present – interpret and share artistic work; Respond – understand and evaluate how art conveys meaning; Connect – relate artistic ideas with personal meaning and external context.
- ◆ Provide guidance to formulating the "Big Ideas" / Enduring Understanding that all students should comprehend:
Art is a visual language. Art reflects and contributes to culture. Art is individual expression.

Who is the workshop for? Teachers, youth service providers, parent volunteers, art docents, and interested individuals who want to improve their knowledge and skill and thereby feel more comfortable in teaching and creating art.
